## Report of the Interim Dean Library and Media Centers

During FY 2015-16 two seminal events occurred that will potentially reshape the future direction of Tennessee State University. The Tennessee Legislature, controlled by a Republican governor, passed a measure that allow employees to carry concealed weapons on campus; and secondly, at the urging of the governor, the legislature also passed a law to reshape governance of the six, four-year institutions of higher education under the Tennessee Board of Regents. Each four-year institution will have its own governing board, effective July 1, 2017. The consequences of these two events will play out over the next several years.

Notwithstanding these events, the Libraries and Media Centers staff did a remarkable job in supporting the resource and research needs of faculty, staff and students. Our public services units, Reference, Circulation, Special Collections, Avon Williams Campus library, provided bibliographic instruction/information literacy to hundreds of students and faculty throughout the year. The Main Campus Reference Department continued its Embedded Librarian Program by placing an information specialist in the classroom to support students' resource and providing students with a library contact. The Avon Williams Campus Library continued its cultural outreach to the community by sponsoring art exhibits and book talks.

Our Collection Management and technical services staffs ordered and processed materials to support the academic needs of the University. Our Media Center's staff rendered excellent customer service to classroom needs of faculty who request media resources and services to fulfill their academic obligations. Also, the Media Centers staff documented the major events of the University on film/video which will be archived for posterity.

Staffing levels have decreased by two staff positions and we are in the process of hiring a Library Assistant 2 and Media Specialist, respectively. All staff vacancies are required to have an approved letter of justification from the Vice President of Academic Affairs and Presidents to refill. We are in the process of obtaining the justifications.

Also, Our Government Documents Librarian, Ms. Anita M. Etheridge, who has worked for the library for 30 plus years, has announced her retirement effective January 1, 2017. These vacancies obviously leaves us short-handed coupled with major long-term illnesses of Ms. Elaine Brown (open-heart surgery) and Mr. Mitchell Chamberlain (back surgery) has impacted our ability to render service at the highest levels.

#### **Budgetary Issues**

The Library has three pools of funds to purchase library materials and resources. These sources of funds include the State budget, Technology Access Fund (TAF), and Title III – SAFRA. The State budget has been flat over the past five years (\$1.6M); TAF funding has been \$110K (they gave us an extra \$30K for FY 2016-17); and Title III was reduced by more than three-quarters (\$250K). Our Collection Management Acquisitions Serials librarian has found it very difficult to maintain subscription levels due to cuts in our overall funding. Big ticket items such as Science Direct, Wiley Online, Web of Science, IEEE Xplore and the aggregate/collection of databases purchased via EBSCO have been difficult to maintain. Hard choices had to be made on what subscriptions to keep and what to cancel. Letters have been written to the academic Vice President, Dr. Mark Hardy, and our Title III Administrator, Dr. Pamela Burch Sims requesting additional funding. No response has been received as of this printing.

#### Accreditation/Reaffirmations/Academic Program Reviews

With budget restraints being problematic, several disciplines have undergone accreditation/ reaffirmations, or academic program reviews. These areas obviously require resources to maintain their academic standings with their accrediting bodies. As Flex Chu once said: "

In our present environment of reduced purchasing power, increased specialized demands and call for accountability, library support for academic programs must become more focused to support needs not only within the parameters of institutional mission and core values but within the scope of program accreditation and program review criteria."

Over the past year and including this fiscal cycle, the following programs have or will be undergoing accreditation reaffirmation and/or academic program reviews by their official bodies: Nursing, Occupational Therapy, Aeronautical and Industrial Technology, Chemistry and Education.

## Support Staff Salary Disparities

A detailed report was sent to the Dr. Mark Hardy, Vice President for Academic Affairs regarding compensation disparities among support and professional staff. Salaries of support staff counterparts at other TBR institutions were research and compared to Library staff. It was found that Library staff is between \$8,000 to \$9,000 dollars below the TRB average salary. I requested that careful review, analysis and consideration be given toward bring library staff salaries closer to the average levels of compensation at the other institutions whose data were documented in the report. Sources of the report were based on the TBR website, <a href="https://www.tbr.edu/hr/salaries">https://www.tbr.edu/hr/salaries</a>, and TSU's 2015-16 Approved University Budget.

#### VIP Visits to Campus

The Library and University had VIP visits from former Berkeley, California Mayor Eugene (Gus) Newport, who toured our library and graciously engaged students;; Minister Louis Farrakhan, Nation of Islam, reception at the Present Glenda Baskin Glover's residence, Dr. Bobby Jones who agreed to meet two television stations (BET and Bounce) for interviews and he also donated additional memorabilia for his library display; Dr. Damion Thomas, curator of the Smithsonian institution's new National Museum of African American History and Culture, to open in 2016 on the National Mall in Washington, D.C. Dr. Thomas was here to collect memorabilia on sports legends such as Wilma Rudolph, Catana Starks, John McClendon, and others. Dr. Ivory Toldson, Executive Director of the White House Initiative on Historically Black Colleges and Universities also visited campus during the University-wide research symposium. Dr. Ansley T. Erickson, Columbia University Teacher's College used the Avon Williams Collection to publish her book Making the Unequal Metropolis: School Desegregation and Its Limits (Chicago: University of Chicago Press, 2016).

It examines the case of Nashville, Tennessee to show the political and economic forces that supported segregation and inequality and later remade educational inequality in the desegregation years. Finally, the library's public services staff of Alabama A. & M, J.F. Drake Memorial Learning Resources Center visited and toured our library. They included Ms. Martha Fuerst, Mr. Anthony Balentine, Mr. Arnold Corbin, Ms. Sadie Davis and Mr. Imani Tucker.

#### Systems/Metadata Librarian

During the 2015/2016 fiscal year, I renewed the SSL certificate for Sierra and Encore, implemented the software updates for Sierra, and supervised the replacement of the Sierra server. I also renewed SSL certificate for EZproxy, and managed EZproxy for remote access to TSU library databases, electronic journals and ebooks for the TSU eLearn and TN eCampus.

Patron records got updated more often in Sierra. The CIT Department and I created and adopted the new procedure for the library to have access to the three patron files (Undergraduate, Graduate, Faculty and Staff), updated daily throughout the year in Excel (.CSV) file. This reporting procedure runs every morning daily. Instead of requesting patron files from the CIT department, the most current patron files can now be downloaded from the network drive whenever the library needs them. I continue to clean up the old patron records and load the new ones for the students, faculty members, and staff.

The library migrated from EBSCO A-to-Z to its new product/platform: Full Text Finder. I switched out the MARC records and coverage load records for A-Z and replace them with Full Text Finder, and continued the routine management of all electronic resources records and ongoing database maintenance. In addition to the 130,000 plus ebooks added to our collection through the TBR consortium agreement with EBSCO last year, more than 42,000 ebook records were added into the system this year. As the digital repository administrator, I continue to manage the articles and the e-journals that can be accessed from the *Digital Scholarship* @ *Tennessee State University*.

I managed the implementation of BrowZine, a new service that allows patrons to browse, read and follow thousands of the library's scholarly journals from BrowZine.com or from one's Android and iOS mobile devices. Simply visit BrowZine.com or download the app form the Apple store, Google play store or Amazon app, and select "Tennessee State University," patrons could gain access to over 3000 electronic journals.

In collaboration with the Government Documents Librarian, I assisted with the preparation for the biennial survey from GPO, and the government documents site visit for the library's federal depository operation and services.

I inventoried and cleaned up MARC records for the old Downtown equipment and created the records for the new ones as part of the ongoing maintenance. I am currently working on the equipment record inventory, cleanup, and creation for the main media center.

The Avon Williams Campus Library began its inventory in Spring 2015 and is still working on the project. My supervision of the Circa inventory process included training the library staff, coordinating the inventory workflow, creating inventory problems reports, global update records, and compiling the inventory summary reports for the state auditor, as well as troubleshooting bugs and glitches.

Other activities include: serving as a member of the University Assessment and Improvement Council, which has responsibility for uploading the dean and the departmental reports in the Compliance Assist!, and creating the library statistical reports for accreditation; serving as a member of the library Technology Council, and as a member of the Web Design Committee, I debug and fix various technical issues. I also assisted Fisk University's library with questions they had with their Sierra system and SACSCOC accreditation.

This is my third year serving as an Innovative Users Group (IUG) Enhancements
Functional Expert (FE) for the Cataloging, Database Maintenance, & Authority Control group,
and I attended the IUG Functional Expert meeting at the IUG annual conference.

The 2015 to 2016 fiscal/academic year was a productive year, and I look forward to another successful year with the library.

# Library Web Master Mr. Phil Yan

During FY 2014-2015 my major responsibilities as library webmaster involved constructing the library's new website from scratch, daily routine maintenance of the library web pages, debugging and repairing bad URLs, troubleshooting vendor database errors reported by our patrons (staff, faculty and students) and working closely with our vendor contacts in several technical support offices in debugging various technical issues. Additional responsibilities involved maintenance of the Web Access Management (WAM) table in Sierra in order that statistical reports show proper accounting. I also created new web pages/images and updates for web content whenever necessary. This process guarantees patron's access to subscription databases and other related issues on our website. Old web pages had to be rebuilt to properly display our newer web server, ww2.tnstate.ed/library.

I also served as a web consultant to other offices and departments on campus and assisted in the development some of the following web projects: 1) Web Survey forms and databases for the English Department, WRITE Studio as well as the Library, 2) Database management for the English Department, Graphic design for TSU periodicals, serials and/books, and 3) Website creation and other technical support issues for other TSU offices.

For the coming year, I plan to work closely with IT department, Public Relations and other offices as well as our library staff to enhance the performance and reliability of the library website by using up-to-date technology such as cloud computing, and software so that the library will stand out as a leading resource of information.

One of the challenges ahead is to further merge/transfer our old files and web pages located on the tnstate.edu/library server to the new library website smoothly and create new pages to fit into the framework of the new web server. It will take time and effort but I am confident that by working collaboratively with the leadership of the library management this challenge will be accomplished in a timely manner.

#### **Computer Specialist**

FY 2015-2016 was a year that witnessed how budget cuts affect the acquisition of resources to support programs. Since FY 2010-2011 I have had the responsibility of managing the state account, which entailed making sure that license agreements were executed properly and purchase requisitions were processed and put in line for payments. The state account provided the greatest portion of funds to purchase undergraduate databases and eBooks. This account consumed most of my day-to-day responsibilities leaving little time to fulfill my computer specialist duties.

Because of budget cuts approximately twenty databases were eliminated along with several eBooks collections. Eliminating twenty databases takes its toll on programs especially when several other databases had to be downsized. The decrease in budget allocations not only affects fewer purchases, but eliminated my responsibilities in the collection management and acquisitions department. Nevertheless, I have enjoyed learning the procedures of purchasing databases and eBooks which involved acquiring contracts/agreements from vendors, routing contracts through the approval process and following the process through disbursement.

As I turn my attention to my computer specialist's responsibilities I will get more involved in our multimedia center's activities, software applications, troubleshooting problems, etc. Understanding and realizing that the library is a focal point of the university I am eager to learn and keep abreast of trends of computer applications in education. Even though very little of my time was devoted to maintenance on computers and software, these responsibilities were not totally neglected. Some of the software that was installed on the six iMac's and two PC's located in the Multimedia Learning Commons received upgrades. These upgrades included the Adobe Master suite that consists of Adobe Acrobat, Adobe Dreamweaver, Adobe Premier, Adobe Photoshop, Adobe Illustrator and Adobe Encore. This lab served approximately seven thousands students that worked on an assortment of projects during the year. Also, the Visual Studio software was installed in the lab and on twenty two PC's that is located

on the second floor Commons. This software is popular and was requested by several students.

Because of budget restraints only one computer was purchased for a staff member and additional software was installed on two other computers. I am hoping that the budget will allow me to purchase new computers for staff during the next fiscal year. In addition to my day-to-day responsibilities I attended two webinars, which included LibGuides and BrownZine. It has been a productive year and I look forward to transitioning back to my original duties to focus on technology issues needed in the Commons and Multimedia Center.

#### **Reference Department**

Mr. Fletcher F. Moon, Associate Professor and Department Head

The 2015-2016 academic/fiscal year reflected both change and continuity in the service responsibilities of the Reference Department for the Library, University, and other clientele. We continued initiatives involving information literacy; embedded librarian relationships; interlibrary transactions; government documents/depository development; collection maintenance and technology and general maintenance/upgrades in the department and public service areas (second floor and third floor library classrooms); expansion of multimedia/computer-based resources, applications, equipment, and facilities; continued use of the University's Events Management System (EMS) for booking/scheduling of meetings, classes, training workshops, and other activities in the Library classrooms and conference room; and other general information/reference services to users on and off campus in a variety of formats.

Staffing of faculty/staff in the department remained consistent throughout regular and extended service hours/schedules during the year. Despite the increased availability/faster response times of TSU Police when needed in support of problematic situations, the department and other public service areas also appreciated efforts by the Library administration to have regular security personnel assigned to the library building (especially on evenings during fall and spring semesters when there is a high volume of students and other users). Discussions have been ongoing with the University administration, TSU Police, and the security company contracted by the University in hopes of acquiring a security presence/station at the entrance to the Library, similar to the campus/student center (which is open fewer hours than the Library during the fall and spring semesters).

The faculty/staff in the department also completed the required University training on recognizing/preventing workplace harassment and discrimination via inperson workshops or use of its online training modules. Several persons also attended

TSU Human Relations workshops/viewed webinars related to employee concerns such as safety in the workplace; retirement planning and options; conflict resolution; etc.

The two electronic "smart" classrooms (315 and 317) continued to be requested for use on a daily basis via the EMS, as well as phone, e-mail, and in-person inquiries. Activities included information literacy, bibliographic instruction, and/or library orientation for various academic departments and programs as well as online testing and/or training workshops for units including health sciences/nursing; institutional effectiveness and planning; testing center; graduate school; information technology/IT; athletics; residence life; human resources; business and finance/travel office; and career development. The department also continued to provide assistance to users in accessing admissions/financial aid/advisement information during registration periods. The classrooms also continued to be used by several English instructors as "online writing laboratories".

The EMS was helpful in balancing the technology/space needs of individual instructors/professors with those of departments and other University units. The Library conference room (also listed in the system) was frequently requested and used for Graduate Council and Library Council meetings; vendor/product demonstrations; meetings with accreditation reviewers and visiting researchers; and other Library department/committee meetings.

Online reference via the "Referencedesk/Ask Us" links on the Library website (homepage) generated additional inquiries from a variety of users, with off-campus access procedures, issues, and problems still among the most "FAQs" (frequently asked questions). Responses from the reference faculty/staff almost always began with confirmation of the user's status/affiliation with the University as a prerequisite to accessing specific electronic resources. As mentioned earlier, the department was most heavily used during the fall and spring semesters, with much lighter traffic for programs such as "Extreme Spring Break" and "Maymester". However, the last month

of the academic/fiscal year (June 2016) was busier than usual, with several different activities taking place as the University and Library transitioned to its summer four-day work week/schedule. On June 2 the Library and department hosted five colleagues from the Web Access Services/Information Technology staff of the J. F. Drake Library, Alabama A&M University (Huntsville, AL) and the Library made its annual presentation to the TSU Upward Bound program on June 6. A new addition was the TSU Band Camp "Scavenger Hunt" on June 16, where six groups averaging about 10 musicians each were given a brief presentation on TSU music history by Fletcher Moon before receiving a clue for visiting another University building. A planning meeting related to an upcoming site visit of the TSU government documents/depository collection from a representative of the Government Publishing Office (GPO) took place on June 20, and information literacy presentations to three "Academic Boot Camp" sections of Speech Communications 2200 June 21 were conducted jointly by Fletcher Moon and Lynetta Alexander.

As indicated above, the Reference Department experienced another very productive year in supporting the teaching, research, and public service missions of the University. Following are more highlights, accomplishments, and achievements of the faculty and staff members of the department:

Fletcher Moon continued to coordinate schedules of faculty/staff in the department, including assignments of information literacy presentations for undergraduate and graduate classes as well as desk schedules and monitoring of online reference modules. He also continued service on a number of University and Library committees during the year, including the University Personnel (Tenure and Promotion) Committee; University Curriculum Committee; Faculty Handbook Committee; Center for Entrepreneurship and Economic Development (CEED) Task Force; Library Technology Committee; Tech-C Website Re-Design Committee; and Library Faculty/Staff Retreat planning committee. He and Michael Doster also

provided music for the December 2015 holiday celebration at the Avon Williams Campus Library.

In addition, Fletcher participated in Library Council and staff meetings; attended the dedication of the Ed Temple Statue on August 28; traveled to Baton Rouge, Louisiana to present a paper at the National Association for African American Studies Conference on February 10; made presentations at the Local Conference on African American History on February 12 and Fisk University on April 29; attended Dean's Council meetings for Dr. Kenerson as requested/necessary; began updating selected research/entries for a new edition of the reference work, *Encyclopedia of African American Business*; served as a judge of undergraduate and graduate student posters and presentations on April 5-7 during the annual University-Wide Research Symposium; met with visitors/researchers related to TSU history/alumni and colleagues from Alabama A&M University on June 2; continued regular administrative processes; conducted annual evaluations/performance reviews; and continued writing/editing reports and documents as necessary during the year.

Anita Etheridge reports that in addition to daily information/reference desk schedules and monitoring of information sources related to news/current events and Federal/government documents, she also completed mandatory reports related to the depository collection; updated the documents shelflist using the Document Data Miner 2 software/system; maintained periodical browsing/other display areas and ordered/updated government documents promotional materials; facilitated continuous review/weeding of the collection as necessary; and conducted information literacy/bibliographic instruction and/or library orientations as scheduled/requested for classes in English and speech communication.

As second in seniority among the Reference faculty, Anita also served as head of the department and attended Library Council meetings when Fletcher Moon was absent or unavailable. She also conducted information literacy/library orientation presentations as assigned/requested; revised/updated the Library disaster/emergency procedures manual; continued daily and monthly maintenance, statistics, and reports related to the government documents collection; conducted retrospective piece-level processing of government documents in collection dating from 1972 to 1995; processed new items for the collection; updated government documents bulletin boards and other information displays; collaborated with and provided support to Mrs. Ester McShepard, coordinator of government documents collection at Fisk University; and completed/submitted government documents survey data as requested, including the depository library biennial survey.

Anita also served on the Faculty Senate Grievance Committee; Departmental Tenure/Promotion Committee; Library Assistant III (Special Collections) Selection Committee; and Research Databases Committee; participated in several online and/or in-person government documents seminars sponsored by the Association of College and Research Libraries (ACRL); Government Printing Office (GPO); Government Documents Roundtable (GODORT); and Tennessee government documents librarians, including Depository Library Council virtual meetings and Fall 2015 workshop at Vanderbilt University; and webinars on PC-based depository processes/systems. She also attended the 2015 TennShare Fest; a Microsoft Excel workshop at Millennium Maxwell House Hotel; the 2016 Local African American History and Culture Conference at the TSU Avon Williams Campus; vendor demonstration of the Browzine database; workshops on faculty benefits/retirement preparation and workplace harassment and discrimination; participated in University convocations; ordered book titles for library liaison areas/departments; and began planning for a GPO site visit in July 2016.

Barbara Vanhooser reports that in addition to regular information/reference desk responsibilities, she continued to spend a great deal of time involved in activities related to the embedded librarian program (discussed in more detail below), including ongoing collaboration with teaching faculty and students; establishing and maintaining

contact with them via e-mails, phone calls, and/or in-person consultations; and staying abreast of technological developments impacting online/distance education and library services. Barbara continued to use Camtasia video/editing software to create library orientation videos for online courses upon demand/as necessary, and to assess the effectiveness of the videos; follow up with students from past embedded classes, and helped with work/research assignments from other "non-embedded" classes. In addition, she also attended the 2015 TN eCampus (formerly ROCC) annual conference in Knoxville, TN, where she was recognized with the ROCC Specialist Excellence Award for embedded librarianship; continued as a co-facilitator of the Library Book Discussion Group with Lynetta Alexander; served on the University Tenure/Promotion Appeals Committee and as secretary of the Faculty Senate Library Committee; participated as a judge for poster/presentation sessions during the University Research-wide Symposium in April 2016.

#### Embedded Librarian Program

The program has now been in operation for over nine years and increased in size and visibility while continuing efforts to impact traditional, Web-enhanced, hybrid (combination of on-ground and online components), and fully online courses offered by TSU academic disciplines independently or as part of TN eCampus (formerly the Regents Online Degree Program/RODP). This initiative continues to provide additional support to students in successful use of library/information resources across disciplines, with the desired result of improving student outcomes related to grades, retention, and graduation in line with University and state mandates.

Undergraduate, graduate, first-year, first-generation, and nontraditional students continued to benefit from the program during 2015-2016, based on relationships with teaching faculty and embedded librarians. Information literacy concepts and skills such as selecting and refining research topics; finding and evaluating the quality of research sources; and proper documentation of research in various style formats such as MLA

and APA, have been reinforced through multiple sessions, interactions, and assignments where the embedded librarian is available in-person and/or online to provide additional assistance. Classes (regardless of format) require students to write research papers and to effectively use library resources, and the embedded librarian program provides a means to "meet students where they are" in terms of their library/research skills and knowledge.

Barbara VanHooser continues to keep a log of incoming e-mails specifically related to embedded courses, in the attempt to respond to as many as possible in a timely fashion. Her involvement can vary from very minimal assistance in the class/group setting to extensive "one-on-one" contact and communication with individual students; in some instances, consultation with the embedded librarian is a class assignment or requirement, while in other cases involvement is part of designated "research days" for courses. In 2016-2017 she plans to administer a survey instrument to students for use as data for documentation/assessment purposes.

Lynetta Alexander continued to "anchor" information/reference services and other responsibilities during her regular schedules, which primarily involve afternoon, evening, and weekend hours when she is the primary contact person in the department. With heavy usage of the Library and the department (especially evenings during fall and spring semesters), she handled a variety of in-person, telephone, and/or e-mail reference inquiries in all academic disciplines, proving that "traditional " reference still thrives along with electronic access to information, and continued to maintain a comprehensive log of reference inquiries/questions and transactions. She also reports that the information literacy presentations she made during the year were well-received (sometimes to the point of applause at the conclusion, with compliments from faculty colleagues as well as students). Her regular schedule precludes assignments for morning classes, yet she has on occasion come in early to conduct presentations as needed or requested.

Lynetta also continued to report increased visibility and faster responses of TSU Police as related to problems/behavior of students and others in the Library during evening hours of service, while also noting ongoing and potential issues with technology/equipment availability and proper use, as well as lost/misplaced/stolen personal items of Library users (i.e., flash drives, cell phones, laptops, backpacks, etc.). She also traveled to Orlando, Florida (June 24-27, 2016) for the national conference of the American Library Association, and reported attending a variety of presentations/sessions which addressed contemporary issues facing libraries, librarians, and library/information resources, access, quality, and services in traditional and contemporary settings.

Lynetta also continued work in selecting new titles and weeding older items from the print reference collection; library liaison and book selection activities with/for dental hygiene, occupational therapy, and health information management departments; continued efforts toward establishing a "sick-leave bank" for faculty in collaboration with the Faculty Senate Benefits and Welfare Committee; and participated in meetings of the University Research and Library Research Databases committees when scheduled.

In addition, Lynetta continued to schedule and co-facilitate meetings of the TSU Library Book Discussion group with Barbara VanHooser. These activities were publicized via University Communications, and documentation of past and current reading selections was also added to the Library website during the year. She also began work with a committee responsible for continuing the rotation of Library Art Corner displays since the departure of Loretta Divens. Beyond her regular professional activities, Lynetta continued to volunteer for Reading is Fundamental (RIF), Tennessee Arts and Crafts Association (TACA), and other civic/community organizations.

Nancy Henthorne reports that in addition to her regular reference and interlibrary service responsibilities and transactions, she conducted information literacy

presentations as scheduled/requested; participated in Reference Department and Library committee meetings; served on the Library Assistant III/Special Collections Selection Committee; attended and completed University workshops on diversity, preventing discrimination and harassment, and benefits/retirement information; facilitated access to the Multimedia Learning Commons as necessary; and changed system backup tapes on weekends/as necessary. She also attended Fall 2015 and Spring 2016 Faculty/Staff Institute meetings; participated in Interlibrary Services committee meetings; ordered books for designated departments/units as part of the Library Liaison program; shelved books and assisted with general collection maintenance; assisted users with scanning and local faxing from equipment in the Reference Department; and substituted for other evening/weekend staff in the department as needed.

In addition, Nancy provided proofreading and minor suggestions related to a manuscript being prepared for publication; decorated selected work area for holiday and other occasions and participated in Library holiday party at the Avon Williams Campus Library; helped with departmental preparations for library visit by colleagues from Alabama A&M University on June 2; and contributed funds toward a new television for the Staff Lounge.

Michael Doster continued to serve as the department's primary liaison with IT, as well as Ellucian technical support staff contracted by the University, and continued to address and document a variety of hardware, software, and other technical issues on a regular basis during the year. He placed 111 work orders with IT between July 2015 and June 22, 2016, and noted that the full record/report of these transactions can be accessed at <a href="https://ellucian.service-now.com/navpage.do">https://ellucian.service-now.com/navpage.do</a>. Michael also reports that he responded to 245 online reference inquiries during the year via the "Referencedesk/Ask Us" e-mail link on the Library website (an increase from 197 during 2014-2015), and referred questions to other Library faculty/staff for additional assistance as requested/necessary. The majority (204) were confirmation e-mails related to article

requests via the "Get It Now" document delivery service, forwarded to Glenda Alvin as these are also financial transactions, while 19 other submissions were answered and/or forwarded to other areas (i.e., Special Collections) as necessary. He also assisted with tape/system backup procedures related to the Library's Sierra online catalog, and continued to address user behavior issues via established Library and University policies and procedures/steps during his regular work schedules as well as overtime duties on designated 24-hour library openings at midterm and final exam periods in Fall 2015 and Spring 2016.

Michael shared his musical talents during the Holiday Celebration at the Avon Williams Campus Library in December 2015, and as part of the TSU Wesley Foundation Community Jazz Band concert (April, 2016). In addition, he supported the successful effort of new/returning employee Jarvis Sheffield to secure a new television for the Library Staff Lounge.

Randyl Johnson continued to deal with many of the same routines, issues, and problems as others in the department during his late evening and weekend schedules, including contacting/informing Library colleagues and/or TSU Polices when students/users refused to comply with Library policies. His consistent attendance and diligence has enabled him to manage the department well when he is the remaining staff member until closing times. Randyl also adjusted his other work schedules as necessary to get Library work hours in when evening hours were temporarily suspended at different points during the year (between Fall 2015 and Spring 2016 semesters; May 2016; and June, 2016, when the Library/University continued its 4-day summer work week and shorter service hours.

#### **Circulation and Reserves**

The primary function of the Circulation and Reserves Department is to provide prompt and accurate service to students, faculty, staff and the community. The department also is responsible for the update of patron records in the Sierra integrated library system to maintain accurate records of patrons. We also maintain traditional and online reserve collections for classes upon request by the professor. We offer patrons search services of materials and make system updates of missing, miss shelved and lost library titles. We assist patrons in providing information on the layout or the library directional

#### **Functions:**

- It operates on a daily basis with the staff checking-in and out of books, and manage all reserve materials
- Sends overdue notices and collects fine monies from overdue books
- Prepares statistics for the annual report
- Conducts inventory
- Clear graduation list for spring and summer
- Provides technical assistance with computer and printing needs.
- Is responsible for shelving and shifting to make room for new books received.
- Answers general questions about the library and other related services

Circulation department is in the process of re-labeling call numbers on book spines that are worn due to heavy usage. This project is nearing completion and Ms. Tammie Evans and Mr. Jim Paxman are overseeing this assignment. It is our goal to have the books look uniformed so that students can read call numbers with ease.

The Circulation department is also in the process of weeding out outdated books to be discarded to make room for new ones. Weeding is an essential component of the library. Because of limited shelving space this process is necessary. Ms. Michelle Vaughn, Stack Supervisor, is responsible for shifting books and creating space for new books as well as overseeing student workers.

#### **Special Collections and Archives**

Special Collections and Archives recently completed a successful academic/fiscal year in 2015-2016. We provided service to 1,954 patrons, including inperson and e-mail inquiries; telephone requests; "hits" (online access) to the Special Collections homepage; access to items on the Library's Docutek server; Digital Research@Tennessee State University archive files; and assistance to patrons seeking help with informational and directional questions related to books and classroom locations on the third floor of the library.

We welcomed Ms. Lisa Parrish from the Cataloging Department to Special Collections & Archives in August. Lisa is responsible for the scanning projects and is a valuable member of the Digital Projects Committee. One of the first projects was scanning the TSU Yearbooks, and with the assistance of Ms. Divens, Mr. Phil Yan and Lisa all of the yearbooks have been scanned and placed on the library's website.

On August 25, 2015 Sharon Hull Smith, Dr. Murle Kenerson (Library Dean), and Fletcher Moon (Head of Reference) visited the Scarritt-Bennett Center to discuss reviewing and archiving the Rev. Bill Barnes Papers at their invitation. We were able to give them insights on arrangements/processing, staff and funding for their archives. After a tour of the archives and buildings on campus we met for lunch and the discussion continued. Many working relationships/friendships were formed, as we promised to keep in touch and provide additional help as needed/requested.

On August 28, 2015 Murle Kenerson, Fletcher Moon, Sharon Hull Smith and Loretta Divens attended the ceremonies for the Edward S. Temple Statue that was dedicated at the First Tennessee Baseball Park. Many of the Tigerbelles and other TSU "family" were present as TSU President Glenda Baskin Glover, the Temple family, sculptor Brian Hanlon, and other dignitaries/politicians celebrated with Coach Temple as he unveiled his statue. The Special Collections staff provided many of the photos that were placed in the reception area near the statue. We salute Coach Temple for this honor, the latest of his many outstanding achievements and accomplishments.

Dr. Bobby Lovett, retired professor of History and former Dean of the TSU College of Arts & Sciences, volunteered to work/assist in processing his papers and other donated materials. He agreed to come in once a week (mainly on Fridays) beginning in September 2015. A designated area was set up for his work, and the

collection was brought in to allow him easy access to the materials. It was a joy for him to come in and share so much of his knowledge about Black and TSU History.

Spring semester brought the retirement and addition of staff members. Loretta Divens, who retired after 14/15 years of service, was a valuable asset to the department as Library Assistant III, as she supervised student assistants, developed numerous displays/exhibits, helped facilitate Library celebration events, and worked on numerous projects with students, Library colleagues, teaching faculty, administrators, alumni, visiting researchers, and local artists in establishing the Library Art Corner display series. We wish her well in her retirement. On April 18 Jarvis Sheffield started work as a new Library Assistant III staff member. Jarvis has experience in scanning, exhibits, processing, media, and technology. As an alumnus, he has a love for TSU, and previously worked in the Media Center as well as held positions at Trevecca Nazarene University and Nashville State Community College prior to returning to us.

Special Collections became part of a national radio trivia scavenger hunt when a photo of a female track star was posted online for identification. Several contestants/patrons thought the photo was TSU Tigerbelle/Olympian Edith McGuire, and contacted the Library to verify if this was correct. For several days we were overwhelmed with calls, walk-ins and emails. The photo turned out to be a track star from CAA and not Edith McGuire.

Glenda Alvin and Linda Bell volunteered to process a part of the Avon Williams Collection (Madison County school case files). The finished collection and shelfist will be put on the website.

## **Collection Management and Administration**

Ms. Glenda Alvin, Assistant Director for Collection Management and Administration

I attended the Association for the Study of Negro Life and History Conference in Atlanta in September 2015. I am part of the planning committee for the Librarians, Archivists, and Curator group. During that conference, I also became a member of the African American Funnel Group, a Library of Congress committee that monitors African American Subject Headings.

In November 2015, I attended the Charleston Library Conference on "Issues in Book and Serial Acquisitions." I have served on the Program Committee for several years. Mr. Jack Montgomery, Western Kentucky University, and I presented a program on "Managing Change in the Collection Management." I am a contributing editor to the conference's professional journal, *Against the Grain*, and published two articles. In June 2016, I went to the American Library Association Conference in Orlando, where I participated in the ALA Biblioquilters scholarship auction for a library school graduate student and my quilt ("Cats' Library") earned the second highest bid (\$300). I attended the meetings of African American Studies Librarian Section (AFAS). The section will transition to a discussion group and I will be the 2017 Convener. At the AFAS Research Forum, I co-presented with Ms. Deborah Lilton, Vanderbilt University, on our Wikipedia-Edit-A-Thon collaboration.

For Women's History Month in March 2016, Deborah and I collaborated on a program to edit Wikipedia entries for outstanding women who had attended or taught at Tennessee State University. Deborah and another Vanderbilt Librarian, Mr. Ed Warga, Scholarly Communications, made trips over to our campus to train the librarians (Lynetta Alexander, Barbara Vanhooser, Julie Huskey, Sharon Smith and Vanessa Owen) and faculty (Dr. Samantha Morgan-Curtis, Dr. Joel Dark and Dr. Michelle Pinkard) how to edit entries. The three hour program was attended by staff, students, faculty and even a librarian from Nashville Public and was a remarkable success. The Vanderbilt librarians have invited me to be on a panel with them to discuss the program at the National Public History Conference which will be held in in Indianapolis in April 2017.

I was assigned to the Library Accessibility Task Force Subcommittee for the TBR Library Dean and Directors group. The committee is endeavoring to find ways to evaluate the accessibility of our current roster of databases. We download the WAVE tool for Google, and tried to analyze it in JSTOR and two other databases, but it was not very helpful. We plan to try to get disabled students to use the databases and report

their findings. I serve as the TBR Library Deans and Directors' appointee to the TSERC Committee, which deals with Tenn-Share issues and I attended its two teleconferences.

New research guides created in 2016 include Music Resources, Mathematics and Physics and Wikipedia-Edit-A-Thon. Librarians were encouraged to add BrowZine widgets to their libguide pages. I revised several web pages such as Black History Resources, Periodicals and the links on Library's Site Map.

#### **Acquisitions and Serials Department**

Ms. Glenda Alvin, Assistant Director, Head of Acquisitions & Serials

Since the state budget was not increased and our Title III allocation was reduced, this year was fraught with trying to make decisions about which databases and journals to discontinue and which to add. We discontinued Consumer Reports, PsycBooks and Family Studies World Wide. We were forced to leave our long held TBR/Tenn Share agreement for Wiley Online Library and downsize to only the most used journals that we could afford, a path we had followed with ScienceDirect/Elsevier and Emerald. We also surrendered our popular Sage Premier All Access and went back to the subject collections subscriptions we held three years ago. Fortunately we were able to negotiate a substantial price decrease for Web of Science. TAF provided extra funding for JSTOR and other need subscriptions. We were able to add *Journal of Visualized Experiments: Chemistry*, which was a faculty request, plus Taylor and Francis environmental journals and BrowZine, an academic journals portal which is being offered at all of the other TBR schools.

Our book vendors, Midwest Library Service, Baker & Taylor and YBP, underwent major changes, but we could not detect any changes in their level of service. Baker & Taylor is now a part of Follett and their continuations operation has moved to YBP, which now supplies our continuations and our firm orders. YBP is now owned by EBSCO, which supplies our journals and databases. Midwest had a major staff change, the senior vice president, who wrote our letter of agreement and provided scholarship donations, left for YBP.

We only had one staff change. Due to ongoing pain and movement restrictions due to work related injuries, Lisa Parrish, Library Assistant III transferred from Cataloging to Special Collections. Scanning the yearbooks and other projects will be better for her physical health in the short and long term. Cataloging now only has two staff members: a Department Head and a Cataloging Manager (an administrative/professional position).

The Acquisitions Department took on an additional responsibility from the Special Collections Department. We are processing the Avon Williams Collection dealing with school desegregation in Tennessee. We finished Madison County (Monroe, et al vs. Jackson) by the end of the year and have started on Hamilton County (Mapp, et al vs. Chattanooga) and the Edgehill Area. Acquisitions and Serials completed the usual summer serials project.

#### **Cataloging Department**

Ms. Julie Huskey, Head

Authority control and general database maintenance continued to be priorities for the department. Database maintenance is important when weeding the collection, as well as when adding new items. Mr. Anthony Prince produced monthly heading reports in Sierra to detect blind headings or other headings needing attention. I consulted OCLC's weekly "Closed dates in authority records" and the monthly "Library of Congress Subject Heading" approved lists to provide consistency in access points.

The department also provided support for the libraries' continuing inventory project, particularly for the Avon Williams Campus Library. I cataloged approximately 470 items that were located at the Williams Campus during the year, and several more from the Brown-Daniel Library. The department also transferred or deleted items identified during weeding projects.

There were a total of 4,966 volumes cataloged for the year, a slight increase over FY 2015. Items that were withdrawn from the collection were processed, listed on an Excel spreadsheet, and offered on the Tennessee Board of Regents email list before being discarded.

Cataloging of additional collections of TSU theses and dissertations was begun in FY 2015. The project was mostly completed by fall 2015, and a total of 365 titles were cataloged during the year.

A cataloging share drive had been created in late FY2015, with the expectation that procedure sheets, other cataloging documentation, and various other files would be created or revised and made available to cataloging and systems personnel. Approximately twelve procedure sheets were either developed or extensively revised. Other items of value to the unit, such as a guide to searching WorldCat, were located and copied to the drive.

Anthony Prince, Sherry Gee, and I attended an online seminar, "BIBFRAME & Real World Applications of Linked Bibliographic Data", in June.

Lisa Parrish, Library Assistant III, left the department for Special Collections in August. Two student assistants worked in the department this year; their duties consisted primarily of processing new books and relabeled books. The student assistant hired in the fall worked only a fraction of her designated hours and was terminated, but the student hired in the spring worked a total of 101 hours and was invited to return in FY2017.

Goals for Fiscal Year 2017 include weeding and counting microfiche, completion of an enhanced shelf labeling project, and preparing for the transition from MARC to BibFrame.

The 2015-2016 academic/fiscal year has been extremely challenging, yet productive and rewarding for our two campus media centers. We continue to strive to bring requested media resources and needed equipment to faculty and students as needed. It is always a challenge to make sure that faculty and students learn more about Media Center resources which are available for their use. We continue to have a budget which is inadequate to provide the media and equipment needed to serve faculty and students. We were able to purchase only one hundred five media titles this year. We try to balance media and equipment purchases to provide adequate supplies of both but always run short of our needs due to budget limits.

This year we purchased: Staples 15-Sheet Cross-Cut Shredder; JVC GY-HM170UA 4KCAM Compact Professional Camcorder with Top Handle Audio...; JVC QAN0067-003 Microphone for Pro HD/4KCam Camcorder; Sony 64GB High Speed UHS-1 SDXC; 2 Dell OptiPlex 9020 Small Form Factor; OptiPlex 9020 Small Form Factor. Media Specialist continue to record the Samuel Shannon Distinguished Lecture Series; the Annual Conference on African American History and Culture; and all graduation exercises. In to these, we recorded a Black History Lecture for the Department of Education; morning and evening events for the Department of Educational Leadership; Memorial service for Dr. James A. Hefner; a Black History Lecture for the Division of Student Affairs; and the 2016 Employee Recognition Luncheon.

Our Media Specialist continue to work with students and faculty on computer projects, Digital recording of classroom culminating activities, lectures, and individual student and faculty projects. Faculty and students come from various departments across the main campus and the Avon Williams campus.

One final note. During this past fiscal year two men have resigned due to wages too low to provide for a family or an individual. One of the men had been with us for several years, the other for only six months. It is difficult to lose employees so quickly and to replace them. The university is making strides to increase pay but TSU salaries are across the board lower than any other Tennessee Board of Regents institutions. I fear we will lose another very good employee before this semester is over if wages are not increased.
