SEC revises apps

TSU's Student Election Commission revised the SGA candidate application process for the 2010-2011 school year to further ensure applicants were qualified for their positions.

In contrast to previous years, the SGA candidate application included a recommendation form to be filled out and completed by a faculty, or staff member.

"This year we wanted to get more of a feel for the candidates," said SEC Chairperson Robert Horton, a senior from St. Louis. "We wanted to know their relationship with professors and others they interact with on campus."

The recommendation form is based on a ranking scale, ranging

from one to five.

The form asks faculty members to evaluate a student's integrity, ability to work with others, as well as their written and verbal communication skills.

Another concern of SEC was the academic standing and sincerity of applicants, due to the removal, and resignation of eight members of SGA last year.

"We want to weed out candidates that want the title, but for all the wrong reasons," Horton said.

Students seeking a position completed an essay on their grounds for running, and one project they would like to see incorporated during their period in office.

Students are also advised to read TSU's student handbook on duties and responsibilities of each position, Horton said.•

Convention starts week

TSU's Student Election Commission kicked off a week of campaiging with a nomination convention in the forum of the Floyd Payne Campus Center on Sunday, April 4.

"It is no accident that (the convention) was held on Resurrection Sunday," said Danny Glover, a senior political science major from Macon, Ga., accepting his nomination for SGA President – a position he seeks unopposed.

In addition to Glover, many other candidates enjoyed the luxury of running unopposed. Some included sophomore class queen candidate Adrienne Harris and Mr. TSU candidate Tyler James.

The convention also marked an unusual amount of absences

and vacancies. Senior, junior and sophomore class officer positions, including secretary and treasurer were all vacant. Candidates created clever

Candidates created clever themes to grab voter's attention and express their platforms. Themes this year included a NASCAR inspired campaign by SGA Vice President candidate Blake Nathan, a "Sweet Tea" campaign for Miss Senior by Tamerah Marable and movie theater themed campaign for Miss TSU by Ashanti Mason Chambers.

Some campaign teams camped out along the Hale Stadium fence as early as 1:30 a.m. Sunday morning in hopes of receiving a great spot to post banners, cups and other campaign materials.

After the rally ended Sunday, campaign teams broke out across campus to begin posting literature for their respective candidates.•

VP candidate shot downtown

As of press time, TSU student and SGA vice presidential candidate Blake Nathan is in stable condition at the Vanderbilt Medical Center, following



injuries sustained after being shot at the Atlantis night club in downtown Nashville last night.

Nathan, a junior aeronautical and industrial technology major from Stone Mountain, Ga., was celebrating with other TSU students at an afterparty his campaign sponsored at the Third Avenue club.

Details about the shooting are still emerging; however, witnesses say an unidentified man opened fire on Nathan and a crowd of other students after being denied entry in the club party, which was free for TSU students.

Nathan was struck once in the

chest by a bullet that also wounded two others.

Students on the scene rushed Nathan to the Vanderbilt Medical Center in a cab, where he was admitted to the intensive care unit and prepared for surgery.

A number of Nathan's friends and Kappa Alpha Psi fraternity brothers gathered outside the hospital, where they formed prayer circles and comforted each another.

A few of Nathan's close friends were allowed to accompany him inside the hospital.

On social media outlets, Twitter and Facebook, students shared emerging details and started a tweeting topic, titled "prayforblakenathan."

Additionally, student leaders have organized a noon prayer service today for Nathan in the Amphitheatre on the main campus.

Campus administrators and TSU Police officers also arrived to the hospital to notify Nathan's family.•

What We Think The Meter endorses three

As Student Election Commission Week began with the Nomination Convention Sunday, April 4, *The Meter* staff interviewed and deliberated over which of the candidates we would endorse for their respective positions.

We have chosen to endorse Shawn Montgomery, Danny Glover and Blake Nathan for the positions of Miss TSU, Student Government Association President and SGA Vice President

respectively.

The endorsements come as a result of interviews conducted by *The Meter* staff of the perspective leaders and are merely our informed suggestions on who best exemplifies the ideals and goals established for the positions.

While we could only endorse one candidate from each category, it should be noted that most interviews were admirable and the candidates were polished, prepared and capable of carrying out their duties.

This year's interviews had a distinction that no other SEC Week has possessed in prior years. Three of eight "ousted" individuals from last year's controversial SGA removals have returned and two have even earned endorsements.

Miss Tennessee State University

Of all the candidates interviewed, we were most impressed with Miss TSU candidate Shawn Montgomery.

The junior speech communications major from New Orleans answered each question with poise, sincerity and tact – qualities our future queen should possess.

One major component that impressed us with Montgomery was her ability to clearly and confidently articulate her platform, which is Together Reaching Unity Through Hope (T.R.U.T.H.).

The staff members could all tell the platform had more substance than being a cute acronym.

Each letter represented a program Montgomery would like to implement if elected. The only aspect that may prove to be negative for Montgomeryis her lack of experience in SGA.

Montgomery's became the favorite, but her opponents should not be taken lightly.

Both Brittany Brooks, a junior biology major from Charleston, SC. and Ashanti Mason-Chambers, a junior speech communications major from Pontiac, Mich., are both prepared to also wear the crown and be announced as Miss TSU 2010-2011.

* Brooks seemed more prepared than Mason-Chambers. Her answers were direct and clear while Mason-Chambers fumbled over some questions and attempted to avoid others.

We also appreciated Brook's straightforwardness and her ability to remain professional during the interview; however, she was not as relatable.

SGA President

For SGA President, we chose to endorse Danny D. Glover, a senior political science major from Macon, Ga.

Running unopposed does not always guarantee an endorsement from *The Meter*, but we chose to do so because of Glover's passion for his position and Big Blue Country as a whole.

Although Glover will ultimately be named the winner, he encouraged students to hold him accountable and not allow him to be complacent in his position.

Glover's only downfall is ensuring his passion seems sincere. Many of his answers were rehearsed and well thought out, however, that could be interpreted as his campaign and reign being all show.

SGA Vice President

Blake Nathan impressed *The Meter* staff during his interview with his dedication and confidence. It is apparent that he has done this before and regardless of circumstances which left him without a position last year, we believe he is more than fitting to the task he desires.

In response to his removal from office last year, the aeronautical and

industrial technology major from Stone Mountain, Ga., adamentally said, "My GPA does not determine my leadership ability."

While we did choose Nathan as our representative, it was close between he and Zachary Joyner, a junior speech communications and theatre major from Gary, Inc.

In fact, our choice for endorsement was so close, either candidate may be worthy of your vote.

Joyner was surprisingly well prepared and intelligently answered each question. In the end, Nathan proved a better candidate for our endorsement.

Mr. Tennessee State University

We did not choose to endorse a Mr. TSU candidate thought there is only one individual running for the position.

While Tyler James, a senior biology major from Cincinatti, Ohio, possesses kingly qualities and experience, he was unable to sell us on his platform and his desire to truly work in the role of Mr. TSU.

In contrast to unopposed yet-still endorsed candidate Glover, James seemed more comfortable in the fact that he was unopposed.


His answers, campaign and overall demeanor seemed to reflect cockiness and a lack of appreciation to the campus that would choose him.

I commend particular candidates that were ousted but are now running for a second time this year.


These candidates have overcome obstacles giving a sense of relatability and accountability despite opinions of others.


It is not simple to persevere through an academic struggle in the public eye.




