*The University traditionally invites distinguished alumni to address the summer graduating classes. Dr. Gerald L. Durley, Class of '64, was chosen this year. Director of the Division of Curriculum and Faculty Development in the Institute for Services to Education (ISE), Washington, D. C., he serves there also as Director of the Thirteen-College Curriculum Program and the Fund for the Development of Post Secondary Education, and as a Senior Program Associate in Counseling as well as a member of the Executive Committee.

A psychology major here, he earned the master's in community mental health at Northern Illinois University and the doctorate in education at the University of Massachusetts, Amherst. For a year he studied in the University of Neuchatel, Neuchatel, Switzerland. At Northern Illinois and at Massachusetts he carried faculty/staff assignments working with students.

A "Big Blue" varsity basketball player, Dr. Durley was president of student government his senior year (1963-64) at Tennessee State. He also spent two years as a U. S. Peace Corps Volunteer in Eastern Nigeria (now Biafra); and also has traveled extensively in Africa, Greece, Italy, France, Spain, and Germany. Although his involvements have been and continue to be numerous, he has worked closely with the establishment of various activities within the Southern Christian Leadership Conference.

Selected to appear in "Outstanding Young Men of America," Dr. Durley has contributed much to the literature and leadership in his field and affiliated organizations including the American Personnel and Guidance Association, the Kenneth E. Johnson Memorial Foundation (Washington, D. C.), and the National Coordinating Council for Educational Opportunity.
