## THE COLLEGE OF INTEGRITY

The college of integrity can now be defined as one which, acting as a balanced whole, makes conscious and intelligent improvement in its interactive adjustments in working towards the achievement of its aims. There are three important implications in this definition: (1) that the work of the college must be directed towards the attainment of certain specific aims, (2) that these aims must be modifiable, and (3) that institution-faculty relations must be such as to maintain harmonious internal interaction among students, individual members of the faculty, and the environment of the college. --Roy W.
