I N S T R U C T I O N A L N O M E N C L A T U R E

Agricultural and Industrial State College shall be organized into seven major DIVISIONS, corresponding to schools at the University of Tennessee. These DIVISIONS shall be known as the Division of Agriculture, the Division of Business Administration and Education, the Division of Education, the Division of Engineering, the Division of Home Economics, the Division of Liberal Arts, and the Graduate Division.

Within these divisions subject-matter grouping shall be known as DEPARTMENTS. Each division shall consist of two or more such DEPARTMENTS with appropriate professors and instructors. Each department shall consist of three or more closely related subject COURSES.

Administrative officers concerned with instruction shall have the following titles: PRESIDENT, the chief administrative officer of the institution; DEAN, who shall direct instruction in all divisions; DIRECTORS, who shall be specifically in charge of a single division; DEPARTMENTAL HEADS, who coordinate the work of several fields; PROFESSOR, the head of a major subject matter department; ASSOCIATE and ASSISTANT PROFESSORS, who shall assist professors or head minor subject matter departments and INSTRUCTORS who shall give courses primarily in the junior college division. Persons employed for part-time instruction in specific fields shall be known as LECTURERS.
