Since its inception, nearly 40 women have been honored and have received the exclusive "glass slipper" award signifying the delicacy, class and valuable characteristics of women.

A small group of passionate, but powerful and committed women were assembled on campus to make this dream a reality, resulting in the inaugural Women of Legend and Merit Awards Dinner being held March 2007. Through the years, the response from the university and community has been outstanding.

That first awards program led to the development of the TSU Women's Center on campus. Just two months after the inaugural Women of Legend and Merit event, the groundwork for a Women's Center on campus began as an effort to give female students the resources they need to succeed in and outside of the classroom.

Jackson and Anthony Mackie in the Apple film, THE BANKER, and received an NAACP Image Award nomination for "Outstanding Supporting Actress in a Motion Picture." Her other recent film credits include Janicza Bravo's Sundance-nominated LEMON and Netflix's ROXANNE ROXANNE with Chanté Adams and Mahershala Ali.

ATHLETICS



Jennifer, a native of Clarksville, Tennessee, began her career at Tennessee State University two months after graduating from Fisk University in 1991 with a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science. She earned her master's degree in Sports Administration from Tennessee State University in 2005. As a student at Fisk, Jennifer was a four-year letter winner in women's basketball, a three-time CIAC All-Conference selection, and a member of the Fisk University 1,000-points club. After graduation, Jennifer was hired as an Assistant Women's Basketball Coach at TSU—a position she held for 11 years.

During her coaching stint, Jennifer served as the recruiting coordinator and oversaw the development of the post players. In addition, she became actively involved with learning the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division I Compliance Manual and how the legislation can be applied. Due to her knowledge of athletic compliance, she was given the opportunity to transition from coaching to administration in 2002, in the role of Assistant Athletic Director for Compliance. Since then, Jennifer has held the Associate AD for Compliance position and currently

serves as the Associate AD for Student Services.

Since transitioning into athletic administration, Jennifer has assisted with the writing, implementing, and overseeing of more than \$1 million in grant funding for Tennessee State University Athletics department to support academic services, student-athlete development initiatives, and compliance. She has served on numerous NCAA and Ohio Valley Conference (OVC) committees and guided the Tennessee State University Athletics Department through two successful NCAA Division I Academic Performance Program Data Reviews. Under her leadership, the Tennessee State University Athletics Department has not been involved in any Level I or Level II NCAA violations.

Jennifer has a love for community service and empowering individuals from all backgrounds. She's a member of the Nashville Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta, Inc. and the Hendersonville Area (TN) Chapter of The Links, Inc. Through her dedication and commitment to service with these organizations and TSU Athletics, Jennifer has continued to develop and sustain relationships with key community partners along with providing services for after-school youth programming within North Nashville in the Metro Nashville Public School (MNPS) system. Recently, Jennifer received the prestigious honor of being the 2023 Thurston Banks Award Recipient for the Ohio Valley Conference (OVC).

In her free time, Jennifer enjoys traveling, spending time with family and friends, attending concerts and Broadway plays, and walking in her purpose of impacting the lives of young people. Jennifer is a Mount Zion Baptist Church member, where she serves as an usher and a member of the Connection Center.



DR. LAQUITA STRIBLING

BUSINESS



Dr. Laquita Stribling is Vice President of Sales and Customer Experience with Randstad USA. Laquita is responsible for ten offices throughout Middle Tennessee and Southern Kentucky. Laquita also serves on Randstad's Executive Diversity Council.

Laquita served as President of the 3rd largest Rotary Club in the world, the Rotary Club of Nashville. She was the first African American female to serve in that role. Laquita also served as the District Governor for Rotary International District 6760 (July 1, 2018 – June 30, 2019). The district was comprised of 62 Rotary Clubs and 3,500 Rotarians across Middle and West Tennessee. She was the first African-American to hold this position. In acknowledgement for her work and leadership in Rotary, Former Nashville Mayor David Briley declared July 14, 2018, Laquita Stribling Day. In 2021, she was also awarded the Rotary district's Trailblazer Award.

Currently, Laquita serves as an Independent Corporate Director with Citizens Bank, the oldest African American owned bank in the United States. She has also

been named Executive Sponsor for OneTen Nashville; which is a national initiative to address the wealth gap and economic disparities among African Americans in the United States. One Ten's mission is to place 1 million African Americans, without 4 year degrees, into family sustaining jobs and careers over the next 10 years. Additionally, Laquita has also served as President and Board Chair of Nashville Cable and Co-Chair of the Nashville Area Chamber of Commerce Education Report Committee. Laquita also serves on several not for profit boards.

In 2017, Laquita was inducted into the YWCA's Academy for Women of Achievement and was awarded Mt. Zion's Bridge Builder Award and CABLE's Civic Outreach Award. In 2018, Laquita was recognized as a Woman of Influence by the Nashville Business Journal and was awarded the Power Movers Award. Most recently, Laquita was awarded Cable's Power of Inclusion Award, was inducted into Cable's Board Walk of Fame, and was recognized among Nashville's Most Powerful People.

Laquita earned her Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff, a Master of Public Administration degree from the University of Memphis, and a doctoral degree from Trevecca Nazarene University.

Laquita is married to Finis Stribling III, and they have three sons: Finis IV, Kylan and Tre'.

Malone-Smith has worked in various roles to include working for the State of Ohio for 17 years, in numerous departments to include Human Resources, Small and Minority Business, Community Block Grants, Training and development. Executive Director for two school districts, Assistant Center Director at FiftyForward Bordeaux and she's held various Human Resource positions across industries.

Malone-Smith served in the Air National Guard for six years, and she holds a Master of Science Degree in Administration (with a specified focus in Human Resource Management) from Central Michigan University; a Bachelor of Science degree in Organizational Development from Wilberforce University; an associate of liberal arts degree from Columbus State Community College; a Certified Business Advisor License from the University of Toledo, a Diversity, Equity and Inclusion in the Workplace Certificate from the University of South Florida Muma College of Business and she is a Certified Leadership Coach with the John Maxwell team.

Past board and community commitments include, Tennessee Coalition to End Domestic and Sexual Violence, Survivor Empowerment Foundation, Workforce Development Advisory Board, Martha O'Bryan Center and Northwest Family YMCA Board.

Janet Rachel, President of the National Coalition of 100 Black Women, Metropolitan Nashville Chapter is a passionate community leader and advocate for women, girls and the underserved. Janet retired from Vanderbilt University Medical Center in 2020 after an esteemed 40 year executive and senior Human Resources and Diversity career in Financial Services, Technology, Higher Education, State and local Government, and Healthcare. Janet is President of Rachel Consulting Service providing career transition coaching and DEI support services to individuals and organizations.

At Vanderbilt Janet served as Diversity Consultant in the Office of Diversity & Inclusion and held roles in Human Resources as HR Diversity Consultant and Talent Operations Program for the Medical Center and University where she launched the Dual Career Program providing coaching and transition services supporting hundreds of relocated professionals and families. She served as Founding Director of the Greater TN HERC (Higher Education Recruitment Consortium) and established their DEI infrastructure, notably launching Employee Resource Groups and advancing community relationships. Janet previously served in as Assoc. VP of HR at Meharry

Medical College, and Sr. Manager of Diversity at Dell Inc. In transition roles with the Metropolitan Human Relations Commission Janet established a community mediation model and coordinated the first statewide Economic Awards Program for the State of Tennessee's Economic Council for Women.

Janet is a proud graduate of Tennessee State University where she earned a B.S in Business Education. She began her career as Executive Assistant in the Department of Communications at TSU and later joined Gail Larsen and Associates, an employment placement agency as Office Manager. In 1978 she joined First American National Bank as a management trainee and enjoyed a twenty-two year career holding roles of HR Manager, Corporate Employee Relations Manager, SVP Workplace Diversity Director and Community Outreach Director becoming the first African American female to report to the CEO. During her tenure she served as the Coordinator for Nashville INROADS and is credited with impacting the diversity of the local financial services industry through her efforts.

Janet is a past CABLE President and first African American to Chair the Nashville ATHENA Awards. A former Metro Civil Service and Human Relations Commissioner and alumni of Leadership Nashville, Janet is founding President of Nashville Urban Bankers, Past Board Chair Middle TN Urban League and has held board and committee roles with numerous organizations including Bethlehem Center, Community Foundation Women's Advisory Board, United Way of Middle TN, Minority Business Development, YWCA, Fifty Forward, Nashville Workforce Network. Janet served as an instructor for the American Institute of Banking and has certifications in Employee Relations, Mediation and Diversity Recruiting.

Janet has received numerous awards and recognition including the Tennessean "Woman Making History in Tennessee", CABLE's Spirit of Leadership and Power of Inclusion Award, CES Harriett Tubman Award, YWCA Diversity Award, INROADS Coordinator of the Year and the VUMC MLK Award.

Married to Coach David Rachel, Janet has two wonderful daughters and four beautiful grandchildren.

Dr. Boyd completed her doctoral studies at Pepperdine University, where she received the Doctor of Education degree in Organizational Leadership. She is also a graduate of Spelman College, earning a bachelor's degree in economics, and Tennessee State University, where she completed a Master of Business Administration degree with a concentration in Finance. She is committed to continued professional development, including earning a certificate in Digital Marketing Strategy from Harvard University's Extension School. Dr. Boyd has traveled extensively around the globe and earned recognition for community engagement and service, and she is a proud, active member of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated. She also serves on various boards, including Citizens Bank, the National Museum of African American Music, the Nashville Ballet, and the Evangelical Christian Publisher's Association.

Regarding her role at the company, Dr. Boyd said, "It is an honor to carry on the legacy of my ancestors, spreading the message of Jesus Christ through the written Word. We are committed to being a leader in providing Christian and inspirational resources for churches and communities across the country."

The vision for R.H. BOYD going forward is to be the leading resource for storytelling through print, multimedia channels, data collection, events, and serving as industry experts. R.H. BOYD is also positioned to assist in the alleviation of social concerns and social injustices, in addition to fulfilling the need for Christian education, commercial printing, and educational resources.

Dr. Cherae Farmer-Dixon has overcome barriers in race, gender and academia, becoming the third woman to serve as dean of the School of Dentistry at Meharry Medical College. Her career in dental education spans thirty-two (32) years. Dr. Farmer-Dixon has also dedicated twenty (20) years of service to her country as a Lieutenant Colonel in the United States Army Reserve.

The Dean is an academic scholar who immerses herself in published research activities dealing with oral health disparities, caries in low-income children, community outreach and intervention, and diversity in dental education. She also works tirelessly to address disparities within minority dental school enrollment.

She serves on numerous councils, has received a myriad of awards from students as well as local, state, and national professional memberships in several organizations. During the pandemic, she assisted and lead a team of volunteers at the COVID-19 testing site at Meharry and had oversight on behalf of the college of two other testing sites in the greater Nashville area. The Dean was inducted into the (2021) Tennessee

Independent Colleges and Universities Association (TICUA) Hall of Fame and was recently selected as one of Boston University's Alumni Award recipients (2022). She is a distinguished 2019 alumna of the Nashville Healthcare Council of Fellows.

Dr. Farmer-Dixon is a native of Indianola, Mississippi. She is a graduate of the 1986 class of Mississippi Valley State University. She has also received the following degrees and certifications: Meharry Medical College Doctor of Dental Surgery (D.D.S.) degree, 1990, and the School of Graduate Studies and Research Masters of Science in Public Health degree (M.S.P.H.), 1994; Tennessee State University Executive Masters of Business Administration (EXMBA), 2019; the Institute of Educational Management Program Certificate from Harvard University, 2017; and Boston University's Public Health Residency Certificate, 2014. Dr. Farmer-Dixon is a 2018 fellow of the International College of Dentists, a 2014 fellow of the American College of Dentists, a 2000 alumnae of the Executive Leadership in Academic Medicine Program (ELAM) and a member of the 2003-2004 American Dental Education Association Leadership Institute class.

Passionate about serving and making a difference in the community, she is a member of the Kappa Lambda Omega Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. She is also a member of the Nashville Chapter of The Links, Inc., and currently serves as the National Director of the Health and Human Services Facet for this organization.
