Event History

The Women of Legend and Merit Awards has become a signature event in support of the Women's Center at Tennessee State University. It is designed to raise awareness as well as funding in support of the TSU Women's Center. Since its inception, nearly 40 women have been honored and have received the exclusive "glass slipper" award signifying the delicacy, class and valuable characteristics of women.

A small group of passionate, but powerful and committed women were assembled on campus to make this dream a reality, resulting in the inaugural Women of Legend and Merit Awards Dinner being held March 2007. Through the years, the response from the university and community has been outstanding.

That first awards program led to the development of the TSU Women's Center on campus. Just two months after the inaugural Women of Legend and Merit event, the groundwork for a Women's Center on campus began as an effort to give female students the resources they need to succeed in and outside of the classroom.



Sophia A. Nelson

Guest Speaker

Sophia A. Nelson, Esquire, is a highly regarded and award-winning author, journalist, and distinguished international motivational speaker.

Renowned for her perceptive columns on CNN Opinion and her weekly appearances on CNN, where she offers expert legal and political analysis, Nelson boasts a background as a former Adjunct Professor of Philosophy and Religion, Big 10 Law Firm Senior Counsel and Capitol Hill Congressional Committee Counsel.

She is widely recognized as a Scholar, Lecturer, and Panel Moderator at prestigious academic institutions such as Harvard's Kennedy School, Bowdoin College, Depauw University,

University of Indiana-Bloomington and Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs) across the United States. Nelson has beenfeatured on prominent national programs such as

Morning Joe, The Today Show, Nightline, and NPR. A trailblazer in Diversity, Equity & Inclusion, women's workplace wellness, and Emotional Intelligence (EIQ),

she serves as a respected curator and trainer in corporate leadership and human resources development.

Collaborating closely with Fortune 100 companies, Nelson has left a significant impact on global diversity and workplace wellness practices, extending her influence as far as Sydney, Australia.

With four bestselling non-fiction works to her name, including "Black Woman Redefined," "The Woman Code," "ePluribus One," and her latest

2022 publication, "Be the One You Need: 21 Life Lessons I Learned While Taking Care of Everyone But Me" (Simon & Schuster 2022).

Nelson continues to make meaningful contributions to literature and societal well-being through her various media, writing and speaking platforms. She is the founder of the new "Redefining Freedom" Foundation located in Virginia, and she is working on her 5th book by the same name, due for publication in 2025.

Education



Dr. Adrienne Battle

Director of Schools MNPS

Dr. Adrienne Battle is Superintendent of Metro Nashville Public Schools, the first female superintendent and graduate of the school system to serve in this role. She has spent almost her entire career at MNPS, previously serving as a teacher, assistant principal, academic principal, executive principal, principal supervisor and community superintendent. A Nashville native, Dr. Battle is a graduate of John Overton High School, Missouri State University and Tennessee State University, where she earned her master's, education specialist and doctorate degrees in Educational Administration and Supervision. Under her leadership, MNPS was named a Level 5 district - the highest achievement - in the Tennessee Value-Added Assessment System in both 2022 and 2023. The district recently received national recognition in the Education Recovery Scorecard for its work on post-pandemic academic recovery, ranking in the top 10 among large urban districts for growth in both reading and math. Dr. Battle was named the Professional Educators of Tennessee's 2022 Superintendent of the Year and the 2021 Tennessee Principals Association Supervisor of the Year and received the Nashville NAACP's Legacy Award. She is a graduate of Leadership Nashville and is a member of Leadership Tennessee's 2023-2024 class. In 2015 she received the William J. and Lucille H. Field Excellence in Tennessee Secondary Leadership Award from the University of Tennessee-Knoxville as a result of leading Antioch High School to become the first zoned high school ever to be named a Tennessee Reward School, the top distinction a school can earn in Tennessee. She is a proud mother and wife.

Leadership



Dr. Sharon Roberson, Esq.

President & CEO YMCA Nashville and Middle Tennessee

Sharon K. Roberson, Esq. is a seasoned C – Suite executive with over 30 years of experience in the insurance industry. She serves as President and CEO of YWCA Nashville & Middle Tennessee, the largest domestic violence services provider in Tennessee. Since joining the YWCA, Sharon has increased the 65-bed Weaver Domestic Violence Center's capacity by 15 beds. She has also broadened the agency's life-saving services, including adding the only Emergency DV Text Line in Tennessee and implementing a children's program at Weaver Center. In 2021, YWCA opened the first-ever, state-of-the-art pet shelter in Tennessee for pets of domestic violence victims.

Under Sharon's leadership, the YWCA has more than tripled its school-based programs, including expanding the AMEND Together healthy masculinity program to eight other YWCA associations across the country. During COVID, the YWCA expanded its adult learning center programing and career services.

Sharon has renewed the YWCA's focus on racial justice by implementing a Social Justice and Advocacy program. Several anti-domestic violence pieces of legislation championed by YWCA have become law in Tennessee under her leadership.

During Sharon's tenure, the YWCA in Nashville received the largest single donation in its 125-year history.

Sharon has received community recognition, including being a two-time Athena nominee, Nashville Bar Fellow, Leadership Nashville alum, Nashville Business Journal Women of Influence, and being inducted into the YWCA Academy for Women of Achievement. Sharon has been named one of Nashville's Most Powerful Women by the Nashville Post and five times one of Nashville's Most Admired CEOs by the Nashville Business Journal. In 2022 she received the prestigious Napier-Looby Bar Foundation Z. Alexander Looby Lifetime Achievement Award.

Under Sharon's leadership, the YWCA was named a 2018 person of the year by the Nashville Tennessean and one of Nashville's 24 Black Leaders to Know in 2024 by the publication. She serves on the Children's Hospital at TriStar Centennial Community Advisory Board and the Regions Bank Advisory Board.

Sharon graduated from Vanderbilt University with a B.A. in Economics and a law degree.

M.DIV Educator & Faith Based Leader Scarrit Bennett Center

Rev. Sondrea L. Tolbert, J.D., M.Div.

Rev. Sondrea L. Tolbert, J.D., M.Div. is the Executive Director of Scarritt Bennett Center, adjunct professor of Business Law, author, and the first woman ordained and appointed as an assistant pastor of the historic Fairfield Missionary Baptist Church.

At Fairfield, Rev. Tolbert founded Sisterhood R.O.C.K.S. (Radically Obedient Christian-Women Kingdom Surrendered), a ministry that empowers women and girls by offering regular development opportunities, distributing products to women and children experiencing homelessness, and holding regular mentoring round tables for teen girls. Additionally, she is the visionary for the Annual Fairfield Sisterhood Tea that empowers women and girls across the community; My Sister's Closet, a free clothing boutique for women; and Pampering with a Purpose, which—in conjunction with various community organizations—provides free health services, business opportunities for women and minority vendors, educational materials and sessions, and self-care techniques.

She's a gifted attorney and served in the judicial system for many years before transitioning to Scarritt Bennett Center as the Executive Director where she's leading the way toward "creating a more just world."

Rev. Sondrea is the immediate past director of the National Consortium of Black Women in Ministry (NCBWIM), Nashville Chapter, where she instituted initiatives involving breast cancer awareness, domestic violence, and HIV/AIDS. She is the visionary for Pink Sunday Nashville that raises breast cancer awareness in churches, synagogues, mosque, faith-based organizations throughout middle Tennessee.

Widely recognized for her work having received proclamations from the State of TN and the Mayor of Nashville. She's received Visionary Award from "Fashioned in HIS image," won the International Sojourner Trutch Award from the National Association of Negro Business and Professional Women's Club and was an ATHENA TWENTY TWENTY-ONE Nominee.

As a freelance writer, Sondrea further equips the body of Christ as the author of "On the Bright Side Morning Joy", a collection of devotionals that awakens and encourages readers to live on the bright side. She has received numerous awards for her work including proclamations from the State of Tennessee, the Mayor of Nashville, the Visionary Award from Fashioned in His Image, Inc., the 2018 National Sojourner Truth Award from the National Association of Negro Business and Professional Women's Club Central Alabama, and an ATHENA 2021 Nominee. Rev. Sondrea is a member of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. and Les Gemmes, Inc., Nashville Chapter.

Rev. Tolbert is a graduate of Fisk University, North Carolina Central University School of Law, and Payne Theological Seminary. She loves reading; spending time with family; and cuddling with Amos, her Maltipoo.

Lifetime Achievement



Dr. Jacqueline Mitchell, Esq.

Executive Director of Enterprise Systems Interdisciplinary Program and Professor of Communications, TSU

Dr. Jacqueline W. Mitchell earned her Master's Degree and Ph.D. in Speech Pathology from The Ohio State University, Department of Communications, with a secondary area of concentration in Higher Education Administration and her undergraduate degree at Howard University in Speech and Hearing Sciences. Dr. Mitchell's extensive international travels have included studying abroad and participating in academic meetings throughout many countries in Africa, Europe, South America and Asia. Dr. Mitchell came to Tennessee State University (TSU) as an Assistant Professor of Speech Pathology and Audiology in the Department of Communications, was promoted to Associate and then Full Professor, and served two terms as Chair of the TSU Faculty Senate.

Dr. Mitchell served as Special Assistant to the President of TSU for the Geier Consent Decree from 2000 to 2006, managing \$73 million dollars as part of the final settlement of the 38 years long Federal Court Higher Education Desegregation lawsuit to eliminate the dual system in Tennessee. Afterwards, Dr. Mitchell became Project Director for the Preservation of Historical Desegregation Documents in Tennessee Higher Education at TSU. Dr. Mitchell's signature program is the annual Robert N. Murrell Oratorical Contest which she has chaired for the last 28 years. Many of the scholarship contestants are or have been enrolled in her Public Speaking class and some are members of the nationally awardwinning Forensics Team in the Department of Communications where Dr. Mitchell is a professor.

Dr. Mitchell is presently Executive Director of the Enterprise Systems Interdisciplinary Program at TSU. She first served as Coordinator of Interdisciplinary Studies in the College of Arts and Sciences, helping students increase their marketability and gain access to remunerative careers in the public and private sectors. Later, as Project Manager for the Enterprise Systems Program (IBM technology), she worked with the Mobile Collaborative Education Consulting firm (MCEC) to help academic departments at TSU infuse cutting edge Enterprise Systems information technology courses into their curricula as boot camps, bringing business partners to TSU and helping students earn certification badges in technical areas that will prepare them for internship placement and lucrative employment in Fortune 500 and other major companies across corporate America. She also fundraises for the TSU Foundation Enterprise Systems Account, sponsoring students from all majors to attend a national conference annually. Dr. Mitchell is also the principal fundraiser for the Dr. Harold R. Mitchell Endowed Scholarship, named in honor of her late husband who established the Department of Speech Pathology & Audiology and founded the Speech, Hearing & Language Center at TSU.

Dr. Mitchell's community service includes having served as a member and officer on the Board of Directors and Trustee Boards of two local Nashville Charter Schools and serving on the Boards of the YWCA and the Tennessee Performing Arts Center. Dr. Mitchell has served on various Departmental, College and University committees at TSU and been honored as Department Professor of the Year, Student Government Association Professor of the Year, been recognized for service by the Tennessee State University Theater Program and received the 2023 Faculty & Staff Award. Dr. Mitchell attends Mt. Zion Baptist Church of Nashville, TN, and is currently a member of Societas Docta, Inc.; Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc.; Associate Jewels of Jack and Jill of America, Inc.; The Links, Inc.; and Carrousels, Inc.

Woman of Strength, Courage, and Commitment



Dr. Carolyn Baldwin Tucker

Retired Metro Council Member Principal, Metropolitan Nashville Public Schools

In 1999, Dr. Carolyn Baldwin Tucker was elected to the Metro Council becoming the first African American woman to win a county-wide race in the history of Nashville-Davidson County. Also, Dr. Tucker is the first African woman to be elected as an At-Large member of the Metro Council. Recently a street was named in her honor (Dr. Carolyn Tucker, Ct) because of her history making elections and longtime service to the community as an educator.

For thirty years, Dr. Tucker was employed with MNPS: five years as a classroom teacher; twenty-two years as a principal, and three years as an Elementary Schools Director. For sixteen years, Dr. Tucker served as a Visiting Professor at Lipscomb University and during her tenure with Lipscomb, for two years she was the Director of Graduate Studies in Education. Dr. Tucker was, also, an Exemplary Educator for the Tennessee Department of Education. In addition, during the 2009–2010 school year, Dr. Tucker was appointed Interim Director of Schools for the Murfreesboro City Schools.

Dr. Tucker is the author of two published books. Currently, she serves as a consultant for a non-profit organization and is a Ladies Bible Class facilitator.

Dr. Tucker has been married to Jesse Tucker for fifty-four (54) years and they worship with the Church of Christ at Jackson Street. The Tuckers have two adult children: Attorney Susan Tucker Jones and Evangelist Randall Tucker, Sr who is married to Ericca. The Tuckers have four wonderful grandchildren.

Government



Charlane Oliver

State Senator Tennessee General Assembly

Senator Charlane Oliver is serving in her first term representing Senate District 19 in the Tennessee General Assembly. Tennessee became her home over 20 years ago when she moved to Nashville as a college student bound for Vanderbilt University. There, she earned a Bachelor of Science in Human & Organizational Development and later a Master of Public Administration from the University of Tennessee in Knoxville. Charlane has over 20 years of experience in government, nonprofit management, grassroots organizing, communications, and community engagement.

Sen. Oliver is the co-founder of The Equity Alliance, a statewide 501(c)(3) nonpartisan, nonprofit advocacy organization whose mission is to unapologetically build independent Black political and economic power and keep government in check. Under her visionary leadership, she turned \$250 of her own money into a \$2.5 million-dollar powerhouse organization in just five years. Her successes through TEA earned her the prestigious

recognition of 2020 People of the Year by The Tennessean and numerous accolades.

After the election of President Joe Biden and Vice President Kamala Harris, Charlane was named among 8 Black women fighting for voting rights in the South. She honed her policy expertise while serving as a congressional aide and communications strategist for U.S. Congressman Jim

Cooper, where she advised the congressman on voting rights and criminal justice reform issues. 
















Your accomplishments as Executive Director has truly been phenomenal, your unwavering commitment to excellence, determination and perseverance have not gone unnoticed.


