A. AND I. GETS PRIZE HOG

Governor Prentice Cooper presented Dr. W. S. Davis, Acting President of the College, with a purebred 200 pound Hampshire hog, Monday, October 11. The hog was won by Governor Cooper from Governor Dwight Griswold of Nebraska because Tennessee surpassed Nebraska in the Third War Bond Drive. Dr. Davis plans to use the hog in connection with feeding experiments in the Division of Agriculture.

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CLASS ELECTIONS

Each class will elect the following: President, Vice President, Secretary, Assistant Secretary, Treasurer and in case of seniors -- one additional faculty adviser and five members to the student council; Juniors -- one additional faculty adviser and three members to the student council; Sophomores -- two additional faculty advisers and two members to the student council; Freshmen -- two additional faculty advisers and one member to the student council.

STUDENT ACCOUNTING

The following points are enumerated to assist teachers in the job of student accounting for the Fall Quarter of 1943:

1. Make out a class record sheet and a quarter sheet for each of the courses assigned you. List on each the names and classification of all students for whom you have received a course card from the Registrar's Office.
2. If you have enrolled students for whom you have no card report their names to the Registrar's Office together with the circumstances and await receipt of cards before listing such students.
3. Return to the Registrar's Office cards of all students who have never reported to class.
4. Record on Quarter Sheets three weeks' estimates and file in Registrar's Office by 4 p. m. Friday, October 22. Keep a record of these grades in your course book.
