## THE FACULTY IN THE NEWS

Dr. Thomas E. Poag was the principal speaker for the Henry County Mobilization Meeting at Paris, Tennessee on January 12, 1944.

The college was represented at the Regional Meeting for Dyer, Lake, Lauderdale, Obion and Tipton Counties on January 15 by Dr. Thomas E. Poag, Miss Lois Daniel, Miss Christine Alexander and Dean G. W. Gore, Jr. The conference theme was "Training for the Present and Postwar Living."

## SENIOR PROJECTS

There has been some misunderstanding as to the Senior Project requirement for 1944. All candidates for graduation must write a senior project. The rules that applied in previous years still obtain. Projects must be submitted at least 30 days before date of graduation. Project outlines must be approved by adviser and one copy filed with Dean at least one quarter before date of graduation. Any teacher in a department may sponsor a project. No teacher may sponsor over 15 projects in one academic year.

## GRADUATE INSTRUCTION

For the Winter Quarter, there are six graduate students pursuing a total of four graduate courses in education and two graduate-senior division courses in business education. One of these courses -- Education 502, School Administration -- is given in the evening, -- 6 to 8 p. m. on Mondays in A207. Other courses on the graduate level and available during the morning-afternoon period are: Education 512, Research and Thesis Writing; Education 501, Foundations of Education; Education 521, Educational Statistics; Business Education 412, Teaching of Social Business Subjects and Business Education 413, Curriculum Construction in Business Education. Two additional senior division courses are available to qualified students for graduate credit; Education 352, Measurement and Evaluation and Education 413, Mental Hygiene.
