EDUCATIONAL STATISTICS

During 1942, a total of 1,209,150 persons attended colleges and universities in the United States.

In Tennessee in 1940, a total of 602,378 persons out of a population of 1,139,873 persons (between the ages of 5 and 24) attended school.

According to The World Almanac for 1944, five Negro privately controlled colleges had endowments of \$2,000,000 or more. Those colleges are: Atlanta, Fisk, Hampton, Spelman and Tuskegee. Hampton Institute ranks first with an endowment of \$9,834,000.
