GRADUATE PROGRAM

Persons who have received bachelor's degrees from A and I State College or other accredited institutions may enroll in the Graduate Division and pursue work leading to the degree of Master of Science or Master of Arts. An undergraduate record of at least 36 hours is required in the field in which the student desires to major on the graduate level. Ordinarily a student will complete 45 hours of graduate work with 27 hours in a major and 18 hours in a minor. Candidates for the M A degree must pass a reading examination in one foreign language, usually French or German.

EDUCATION

REQUIREMENTS IN EDUCATION FOR PERMANENT PROFESSIONAL HIGH SCHOOL CERTIFICATES

The professional requirements for high school teachers in Tennessee are:

(A) Educational Psychology	3 quarter hour credits
(B) Principles of Secondary Education	3 quarter hour credits
(C) (Materials and methods in high school subjects	6 quarter hour credits
{ and	
(Directed or practice teaching	3 quarter hour credits
or	
(D) Materials and methods	9 quarter hour credits
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Total	15 quarter hour credits

The remaining 12 quarter hours are elective and will be selected from courses in the field of secondary education.

The electives to be selected from the following list:

(A maximum of 3 quarter hours in each course).

1. History of Education or History of Education in the United States.
2. Adolescent Psychology.
3. Educational Tests and Measurements.
4. High School Administration, Organization, and Management.
5. Educational Sociology.
6. General Psychology.
7. Curriculum of the High School.
8. Philosophy of Education.
