Special Registration Features -- All students will register in terms of the schedule for their Division. Substitutions when necessary will be made within the Divisional set-up. Whenever it becomes necessary for an adviser to assign a student to a class or section or a class listed under some other division, the student should be sent to the Dean's Office for approval of his course card.

Beginning with the Spring Quarter each Division will have a distinctive color card. Liberal Arts -- White; Education -- Blue; Business -- Pink; Engineering -- Red; Home Economics -- Green; Agriculture -- Yellow.
