CONGRATULATIONS DOCTORS

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS TO INSTRUCTORS

1. Get course cards from Registrar's Office each morning March 21-25 inclusive.
2. Officially record in your course only persons for whom cards are received.
3. Check course cards to see if student is reporting to correct section for his Division.
4. Send to Dean's Office all persons who are in the wrong section on basis of major Division unless their course cards are approved by Dean.
5. Send to Registrar's office all persons who report to classes but for whom no course card has been received.
6. Return to Dean's Office the course cards of persons who have not reported to class by Tuesday, March 28.
7. Each Monday morning return to Dean's Office course cards of students who have accumulated 3 or more absences.
8. Six-weeks Examinations will be held at regular class hour on Wednesday and Thursday, April 26 and 27.
9. Tentatively, final examinations for the Spring Quarter will be held the week of May 29.
10. Baccalaureate services and Commencement Exercises will be held on June 4 and 5 respectively.
