FRESHMAN TESTS

Freshman Examinations will be repeated in the College Auditorium on Tuesday, October 3, from 1 - 5 p. m. The tests will be open to all first and second quarter freshmen. The Freshman Guidance Committee will be in charge of the test.

CLASSES AFTER CHAPEL

On chapel days, the Ten O'clock Class begins after the dismissal of chapel and extends until 11:15. The Eleven O'clock Class begins at 11:20 and extends to 12:10 p. m.

THE GRADUATE DIVISION

Admission to the Graduate Division of the College may be secured upon application by qualified students who hold the bachelor's degree from an accredited four-year college. Graduate students who have completed at least 15 quarter hours of advanced work with an average grade of at least B may apply to the Graduate Council for permission to become a candidate for a master's degree.

The degree requirements may be summarized as follows: (a) Residence - at least 36 weeks including the probationary period of 12 weeks; (b) Course credit - at least 45 quarter hours of work, 36 of which must be at the 500 level or above; (c) Course sequence - either a major of 45 hours or a major of 27 hours and one minor of 18 hours or a major of 27 hours and two minors of 9 hours each; (d) Quality of Work - B average with no grade lower than C; (e) Thesis - preparation of a thesis under direction of a research committee; (f) Final Examination - an oral examination - an oral examination to include materials of thesis and of the fields covered in courses.

Minimum undergraduate requirement for beginning (1) a graduate major - 36-45 hours depending upon the subject; (2) a graduate minor 18-27 hours depending upon the subject. Maximum load per quarter for full-time students - 15 hours; for persons employed full-time - 6 hours. Registration fee for Tennessee students for 9-15 hours per quarter - \$20; 6 hours - \$14; 3 hours - \$7. Out-of-state students pay \$6.00 extra per quarter.
