The following officers are to be elected; President, Vice-president, Secretary, Assistant Secretary and Treasurer.

In the Freshman and Sophomore classes, two additional faculty advisers are to be elected. In the Junior and Senior classes, one additional faculty adviser is to be chosen. The results of elections are to be reported to the Dean's Office at the close of the period (10:30 a m ).

ADDITIONAL REGISTRATION STATISTICS

As of October 6, the total registration figure was 995. Twenty-two states and the District of Columbia were represented. Forty-three out of 87 counties of the State of Tennessee with a significant Negro population were represented.

SENIOR PROJECTS

During 1944-45 all candidates for graduation with the bachelor's degree must write a project on some phase of their major field during the senior year. The requirements of the previous years will be followed with the exception that only one of the three required copies must be bound, the other two copies may be bound only if the student so desires. Final copies of the project must be signed by the faculty member who served as the adviser (but not necessarily the departmental

head) and the head of the division in which the project is written. The bound copy of the Senior Project will be kept on file in the office of director of the Division.

All theses prepared by candidates for Master's degree must be bound. Two of the four copies will be filed in the Library, one given to the Sponsor and one to the student.

CERTIFICATION DATA

(To change from high school certificate to elementary certificate after graduation and vice versa.)

The holder of a permanent professional high school certificate may obtain the permanent professional elementary certificate upon completion of the following courses:
