PROPOSED RETIREMENT SYSTEM FOR TEACHERS OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE

The proposed system provides for the payment of retirement allowances to teachers retired on account of service or disability. It also provides for the return to the teacher of his contributions in the event of withdrawal before retirement, and the payment to his estate or designated beneficiary of his contributions in the event of his death before retirement. Salary or compensation in excess of \$2,500 per annum is limited to \$2,500 per annum for the purposes of the retirement system. The system will be described in greater detail next week.
