### EDUCATION

### THE AMERICAN NEGRO IN COLLEGE, 1943-44

For the thirty-third time THE CRISIS has presented statistics covering Negro graduates from colleges in the United States. In August 1944 issue there appears a photograph of Mrs Martha W Wheeler, first recipient of the master's degree at Tennessee State (p. 233) and a photograph of Miss Virgie G Hale, ranking undergraduate in the class of 1944 (p. 255).

In comparative statistics, Tennessee A & I State College rated third, surpassed by Howard with 2355 students and 86 graduates and by Prairie View State College with 1353 students and 55 graduates. Tennessee A & I State College was credited with 1256 students and 117 graduates.

### FACULTY ACTIVITIES

Prof Merle R Eppse has just received official notification of election to membership in the American Association of University Professors.

Dr George W Gore, Jr, was one of eight contributors to a Symposium on "The Role of the Negro College in the Post-War World" in the June issue of THE NEGRO COLLEGE QUARTERLY. The title of his article is "A Functional Program for the State Teachers College".

### STUDENT ACCOUNTING

The following points are enumerated to assist teachers in the job of student accounting for the Fall Quarter of 1944:

1. Make out a class record sheet and a quarter sheet for each of the courses assigned you. List on each the names and classification of all students for whom you have received a course card from the Registrar's Office.
2. If you have students for whom you have no card, report their names to the Registrar's Office together with the circumstances and await receipt of cards before enrolling such students.
3. Return to the Dean's Office cards of all students who do not report to class by October 2nd.
4. Students are officially dropped from classes when they have secured a maximum of three absences.
