CANDIDATE NUMBER TWO'S AVAILABILITY WILL BE THURSDAY AND FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 12 AND 13. NUMBER THREE MAY BE TALKED TO MONDAY AND TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 16 AND 17. NUMBER FOUR IS TO BE SEEN THURSDAY AND FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 19 AND 20 AND THE FIFTH CANDIDATE, ARRIVING SUNDAY THE 22, WILL BE AVAILABLE FOR MONDAY AND TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 23 AND 24 MEETINGS.
