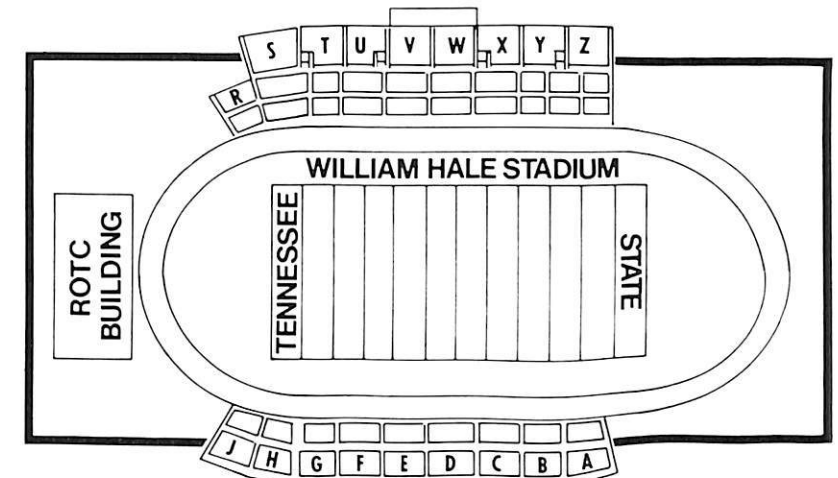

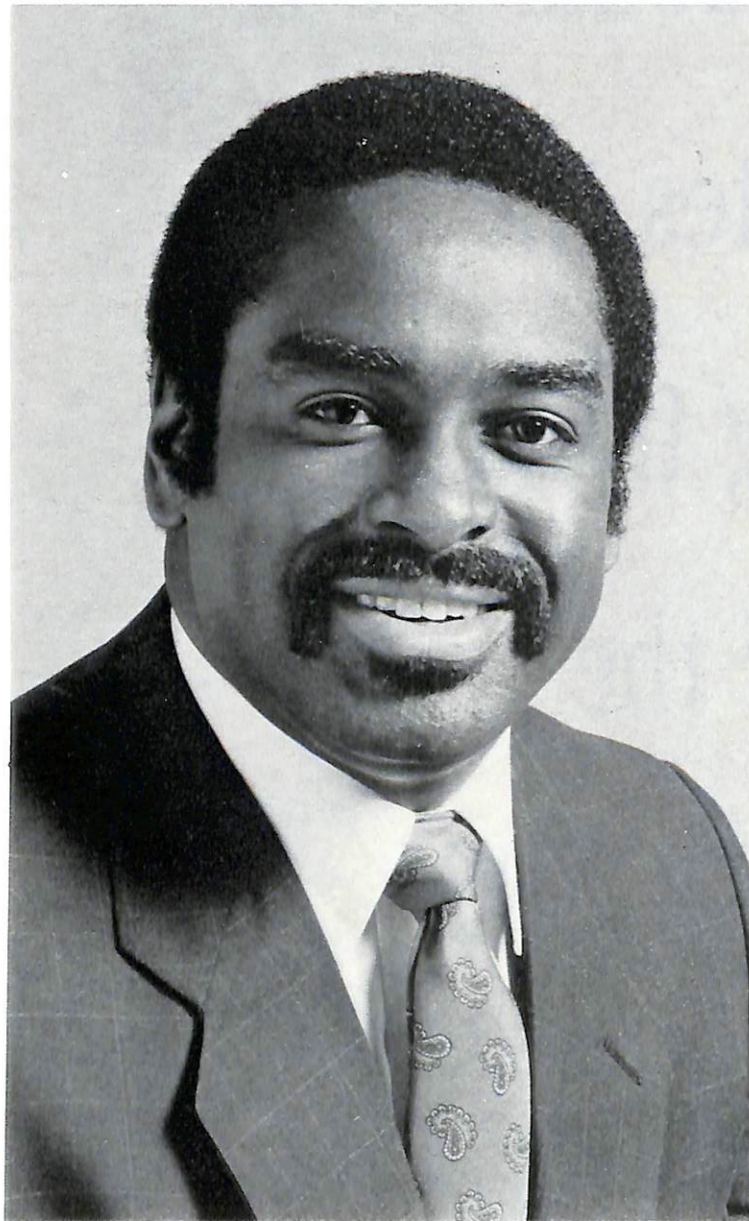

The Coach

William A. Thomas



William A. Thomas
(4-Year Record 30-14-2)
**Athletic Director/
 Head Football Coach**

William Thomas is the only head football coach in Tennessee State's history who has come up through the ranks at his alma mater. From student athlete to assistant coach to head coach and athletic director, Bill's elevation can be attributed to his value of hard work and persistence.

Coach Thomas, a 1970 graduate in physical education, enters his fifth season as the head coach. In his first year, the Tigers recorded a perfect 11-0 season. He achieved a 7-4 record in his second season. In 1980, the Jacksonville, Florida, native led the Tigers to a fourth place finish in the NCAA playoffs with a 9-3-1* regular season state slate. He was named "Coach of the Year" by the Birmingham Forecasters, and "Independent Coach of the Year" by the Atlanta 100% Wrong Club. Under Thomas the Tigers have a winning percentage of 82.3%.

He was named Athletic Director in 1986 by TSU President Dr. Otis Floyd. His main priority is to achieve excellence in academics as well as athletics for the Tennessee State University sports programs.

As a player, Thomas was a linebacker under former coaches John Merritt and Joe Gilliam. From 1966-1970, the Tigers compiled a 30-6-1 record. In 1970 the Tigers recorded a perfect 11-0 season and a post-season 26-25 Grantland Rice Bowl win over Southwestern Louisiana.

After serving as a graduate assistant coach under coach Joe Gilliam, Thomas moved into the defensive assistant coaching position. In 1980, he was promoted to the defensive coordinators job. Some of his outstanding alignments proved successful as the Tiger defense was nationally ranked in the NCAA for three straight years.

His career includes 15 years of coaching, a Bachelor's Degree and Master's Degree in Physical Education from Tennessee State University and further study toward a terminal degree. Coach Thomas is a super recruiter and player motivator. The dual role as athletic director and head football coach offers many challenges to this versatile administrator. He is married to the former Gayla Boyd from Dayton, Ohio. They are the proud parents of a daughter Tosha Bille.

ASSISTANT COACHES



JESSE JAMES - ASSISTANT HEAD COACH/BACKFIELD. A former Tennessee State University Offensive Guard from Ocala, Florida, James enters his 16th year as line coach of the Big Blue. During his collegiate days at TSU he was fearless, as he blocked and pulled to help lead the Tigers to three consecutive post-season bowl victories. James is a hard worker who brings loads of enthusiasm to the playing field. He graduated from Tennessee State University and holds a Bachelor's Degree and Master's Degree in Physical Education. He has gained additional hours toward a terminal degree. His main duties involve teaching the backfield. His linemen are largely responsible for Tennessee State's excellent passing arsenal. His offensive linemen are known around the TSU Campus as the "James Gang." **James at a glance:** Born: December 5, 1950; Alma Mater: Tennessee State, 1973; Spouse: Pamela; Children: Jason, Michelle, Jared; Hobbies: racketball, bowling, chess and reading.



TYRONE MCGRUFF - OFFENSIVE LINE COACH. A three-time All-American, Tyrone McGriff begins his first year on staff as offensive line coach. A Gifford, Florida native, McGriff played on the Rattlers' national championship teams in 1977 and 1978. He earned All-American honors in 1977, 1978 and 1979, a time during which FAMU posted a superb 30-5-0 record. A 1980 draft pick of the Pittsburgh Steelers, McGriff earned all-rookie honors in 1980. He played with the Steelers through the 1982 season, then played on the USFL's Michigan Panther teams of 1983 and 1984. He inked a pact with the league's Memphis Showboats in 1985. **McGriff at a glance:** Born: January 13, 1958; Alma Mater: Florida A&M University; Spouse: Barbara Rollins; Children: Tyrone Jr., April; Hobbies: golf, traveling and all sports.



CRAIG GILLIAM - DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR. Coach Craig Gilliam played on the Tennessee State University Football Team from 1963 to 1967. While at TSU, Gilliam set the single season record for interceptions in 1966 with 13. He was a member of two national championship squads, 1965 (10-0-1) and 1966 (11-0-0). He graduated from Tennessee State University with a Bachelor's Degree and a Master's Degree in Physical Education. After serving time in the U.S. Army, he coached at Lincoln High School in East St. Louis, Illinois, for three years. He was also assistant head football coach and defensive coach at Bishop College in Dallas, Texas, for two years. This season is but another challenge to the young coach. **Gilliam at a glance:** Born: October 11, 1945; Alma Mater: Tennessee State (1966); Spouse: Deborah Carpenter; Children: Tiffany Alexis; Hobbies: taping music, family outings.



ALVIN C. COLEMAN - OFFENSIVE CONSULTANT - PART-TIME. Coach Coleman is the senior member of the coaching staff. He has no peers when it comes to using the pro-type offensive alignments as his basic offense. "Dean" coached TSU Eldridge Dickey, Robert Shanon, Ken Pettiford, Austin Thompson, Joe "Jefferson Street" Gilliam, Joe "747" Adams, Brian Ransom, Kenneth Biggles and Gilbert Renfro. He engineered an offense that struck fear in the eyes of the defender, not knowing when, where or how far, even on 4th down passing. He has the distinction of having three runningbacks in the same backfield drafted into the NFL the same year. The personable, quiet, fiercely competitive Coleman has spent over a quarter of a century in college education. He received his Bachelor's Degree and Master's Degree from Alcorn and Michigan University respectively. In 1963, Dean, Big John Merritt and Joe Gilliam, Sr. left Jackson State and brought their triangle coaching staff to Tennessee State University. **Coleman at a glance:** Born: May 14, 1913; Alma Mater: Alcorn State; Spouse: Helen Dennis; Children: Alvin Jr., Maceo; Grandchildren: Paul, Kanika, Tahirah.

ASSISTANT COACHES

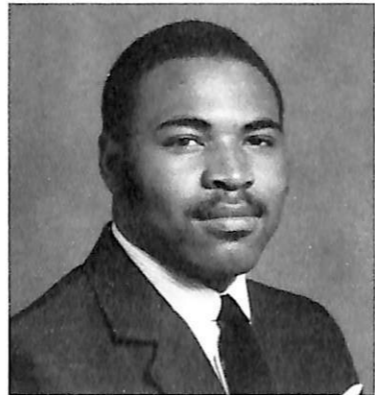
LOUIS HARRIS - LINEBACKER/FILM EXCHANGE COACH. Coach Harris received his Bachelor's Degree and Master's Degree in Industrial Technology Education from Tennessee State University. He served as graduate assistant coach under Bill Thomas while he was defensive coordinator for two years. As a former linebacker, he was an outstanding player for the Tigers. In 1979, he led the defense with 11 quarterback sacks. Harris helped the Tigers to a 36-10 four year record from 1977-80 and was on the NCAA National Pass Defensive Championship unit which ranked number one in 1979. **Harris at a glance:** Born: September 1, 1958; Alma Mater: Tennessee State; Spouse: Angela M. Garner; Hobbies: racketball, swimming, weight lifting, jogging.



MARK ORLANDO - OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR. Coach Orlando begins his fifth year at Tennessee State University. He received his Bachelor's Degree from Florida State University. He was a standout quarterback for the Seminoles, and later played quarterback in the World Football League for the Jacksonville Express Football Club. He taught and coached at Lincoln High School in Tallahassee, Florida, helping to establish them as one of the highly regarded athletic programs on the high school level. He served as offensive coordinator for the Florida A&M Rattlers from 1979 to 1983. As the wide receiver and quarterback specialist coach, he developed All-Meac Receiver Ray Alexander and Quarterback Nathaniel Koonce into NCAA National Leaders. Orlando served as offensive halfback coach at TSU before he was elevated to offensive coordinator this year. **Orlando at a glance:** Born: March 20, 1953; single Alma Mater: Florida State; Hobbies: racketball, golf.



ANTHONY CURRIE - DEFENSIVE BACKS. Currie will be part of the Tiger football program for the first time this year and will over see the defensive secondary corps. A native of Greensboro, N.C., he was a standout defensive back at North Carolina A&T University. He graduated with a degree in health and physical education in 1981. Currie worked for his alma mater two years as secondary coach. He has also coached at Southern University 1984-1987; Prairie View A&M University, Livingston College and Greensboro's Northwest High School. He was an outstanding defensive back and running back during his prep years at Page High School. Working with automobiles is one of his interests. He recently married the former Ruth Scott of Saxe, Virginia. **Currie at a glance:** Born: January 7, 1958; Hobbies: sports, automobiles, reading.



LEON L. MOORE - EQUIPMENT MANAGER. Leon was an outstanding football player at Tennessee State University from 1963-67 under Big John Merritt. During that time, the Tigers only lost five games and went unbeaten two seasons. Leon was a four year starter at weakside end and safety. He was drafted by the Los Angeles Rams in the fourth round in 1967 and played football in the NFL until 1969. He received his Bachelor's Degree from Tennessee State University. Leon has coached at Fisk University, Central State, Texas Southern and Fayetteville State University. **Moore at a glance:** Single; Alma Mater: Tennessee State.

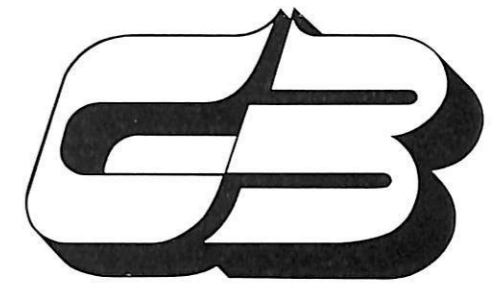

TSU 1988 OUTLOOK

The 1988 edition of the Tennessee State University Tigers football team will be the first to compete in the Ohio Valley Conference (OVC). TSU, a longtime independent power in Division 1AA, will compete for the OVC Championship this year against Middle Tennessee State, Eastern Kentucky, Tennessee Tech, Austin Peay State, Morehead State and Murray State. The Big Blue Tigers will also face traditional non-conference rivals Jackson State, Mississippi Valley State, Florida A&M State, Southern and Grambling.

Head Football Coach William A. Thomas, who has compiled a four-year career record of 30-14-2, has added two new coaches for the upcoming campaign. Tyrone McGriff is the offensive line coach and Anthony Currie is defensive back coach. Thomas elevated Mark Orlando to offensive coordinator. The team includes 42 returning lettermen.

THE OFFENSE

Quarterback: Chauncey Hines, a 6-3 missile-arm QB (425 yards and 5 TD's), should rise as the starter. Ben Brown and Stacy Gear wait in the wings to challenge Hines for the quarterback job.

Halfback: James Reese, Melvin Waters (278 yards and a TD), Dion Martin and Tim Cross will carry the load in the backfield. Sleeper for the Tigers may be Nashville's own multi-purpose running back, Shawn Malone. Malone sat out last year and is now ready to make his presence felt.

Wide Receivers: The wings of the air attack for the Tigers will be Zachary Lewis, Anthony Owens, Alvin Griffin and Chris Hayes.

Offensive Line: Veteran "Big Cats" starters are 6-4 250 lb. LT Barry Nixon; 6-1 260 lb. LG Virgil Hawkins; 6-4 260 lb. OC Mike Jackson; 6-4 270 lb. RG Amzie Smith; and 6-5 350 lb. RT Darrell Parnell. They will be backed up by 6-9 300 lb. Willie Clark; 6-2 270 lb. Lamar Love; 6-3 300 lb. George McKinney; and 6-5 280 lb. James Wilkerson. This group represents the largest line in Tiger history.

Tight Ends: The TE position is in the capable hands of senior Gary Hockett, who scored 5 TD's last

season. He will receive pressure from improving junior, Tyrone Watson.

Kicker: Joe Guydon will replace Andre' Sherrill as the kicker.

Punter: Van Overton is ready to fight off any competition for the punt position.

Returner: Last season's NCAA punt return champion Craig Hodge will be replaced by speedy Shawn Malone, who is no doubt the fastest player on the Tiger's squad with 4.3 speed in the 40 yard dash.

THE DEFENSE

Defensive Ends: The ends will be veteran starters Lee Smith (110 tackles and the returning leader in QB sacks with 6) and Anthony Pleasant. Strong competition, however, will come from Gerald Hall and Bryan Laws.

Defensive Tackle: Arbutus Price, 63, 255 lb.; and newcomer, Scott Moore, 6-2, 240 lb., will battle challengers Jerry White, 6-0, 260 lb.; Robert Porcher, 6-4, 240 lb.; and Michael Beamon, 6-0, 240 lb., for the Cats front line of defense.

Linebackers: The return of All-American candidate Roderick Reed, who last season collected the MVP Award for his record breaking performance of 197 tackles, plus the return of senior, Frederick Robinson, who collected 132 tackles last season, indicates that the moving of former defensive lineman Karl Chatman (98 tackles), to linebacker, possibly will formulate one of the finest linebacking crews at TSU in a long while. Newcomer, Edward Goodman, appears ready to knock heads with the best, and will challenge for playing time.

Defensive Back: All-American candidate Ben Robinson, a corner back, who collected 98 tackles as a junior last season, is ready to go out in a blaze of glory. Robinson will team with Tony Stargell, Orsorio Jackson, and newcomer, Anthony Shelton, to form a strong secondary unit. They will be pressed hard by Kenneth Jones, Kevin Smith, Joe Stone and Nathan Robertson.

Major: Elementary Education; **Date of Birth:** 10-01-65; **Age:** 22.

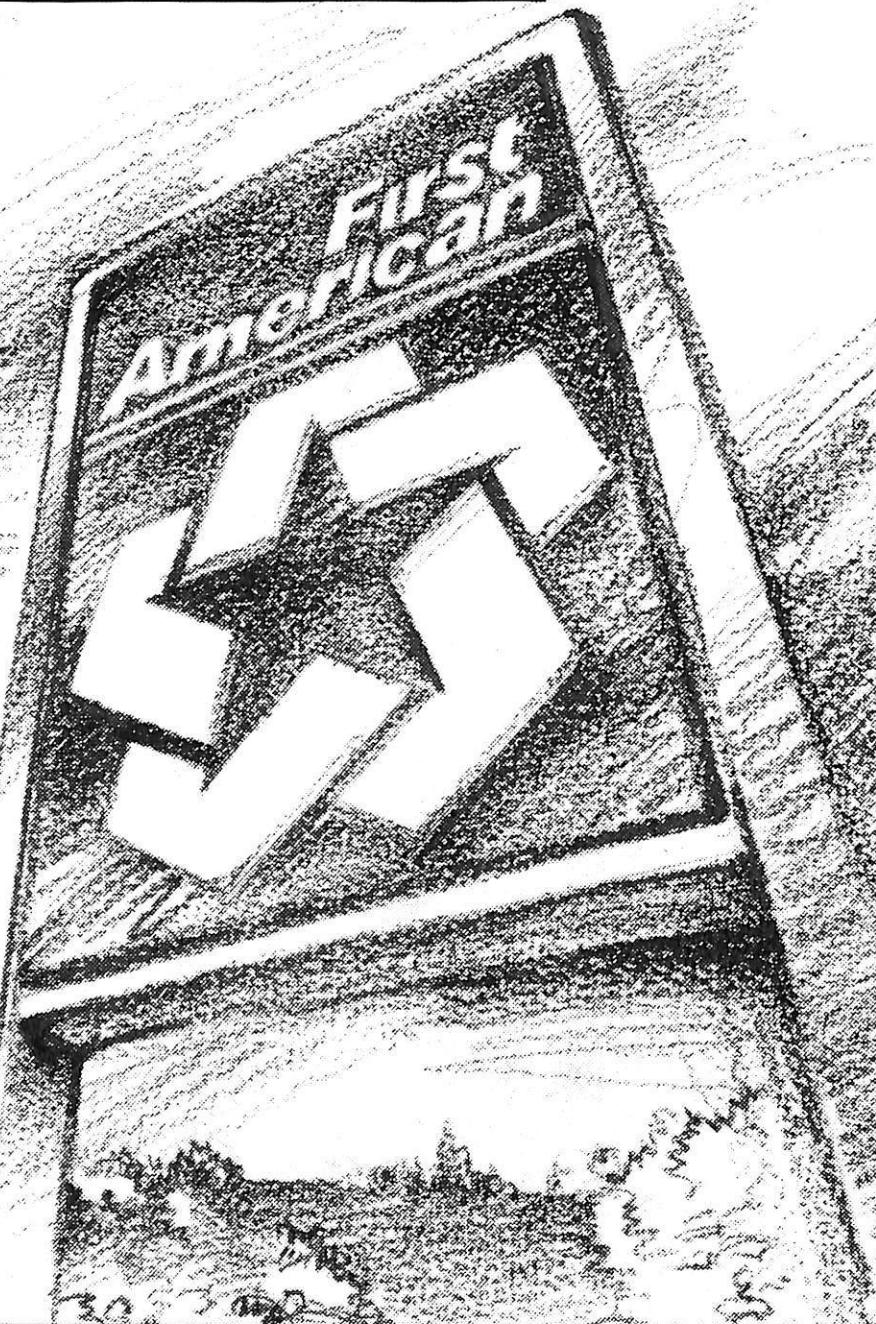

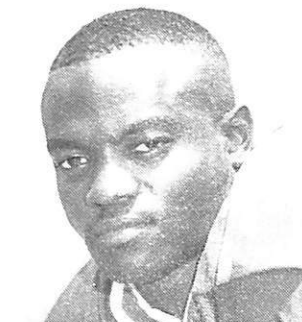


NO. 38 BRYAN LAWS, Senior Outside Linebacker 6'4", 210 lbs.

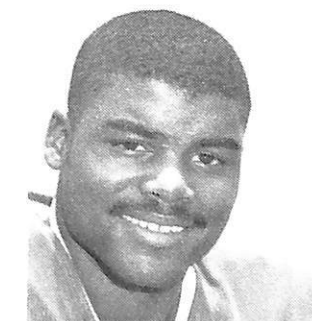


NO. 34 DION MARTIN, Senior Fullback 6'1", 200 lbs.

Kevin is a transfer player who has been plagued by injuries. He possesses excellent skills and outstanding football intelligence for his position. He is expected to stay injury free and contribute greatly as the back up behind Ben Robinson.

1988 National Collegiate Division I-AA Football Championship

The National Collegiate Division I-AA Football Championship is under the control, direction and supervision of the four-member NCAA Division I-AA Football Committee elected by the NCAA membership at the annual Convention.

Chair of the committee is Beanie Cooper, Indiana State University. Other committee members are Benny Hollis, director of athletics, Northeast Louisiana University; Walter Reed, director of athletics, Florida A&M University, and Rick Taylor, director of athletics, Boston University. Dennie Poppe, NCAA director of men's championships, works closely with the committee in the administration of the championship and related matters.

Selection of teams and conduct of championship competition are the responsibility of the committee. The Division I-AA Football Championship provides for a field of 16 teams. Sixteen teams play first-round games on the campuses of competing institutions.

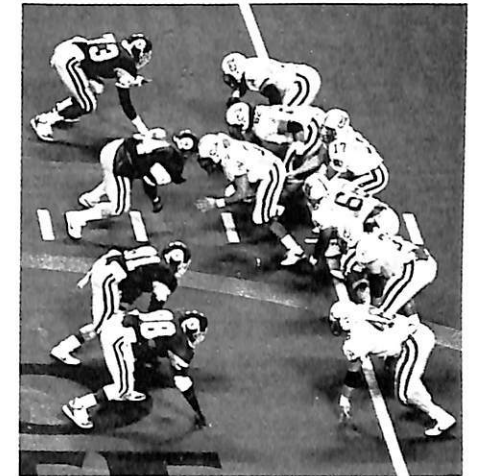
The top two independent teams, as evaluated by the committee, receive automatic berths. The champions of seven

conferences—Big Sky Conference, Gateway Collegiate Athletic Conference, Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference, Ohio Valley Conference, Southern Conference, Southland Conference and Yankee Conference—also are granted automatic qualification. The committee selects the remaining teams at large with assistance from four regional advisory committees.

Teams are selected for the championship on the basis of the following criteria (not in preferential order): (1) eligibility of student-athletes for NCAA postseason competition, (2) won-lost record, and (3) strength of schedule.

The committee is responsible for all pairings and seedings. The top half of the bracket has the Nos. 1- and 4-seeded teams and the lower half has the Nos. 2- and 3-seeded teams. Teams are placed in the appropriate region according to the seeding of the top four teams.

The criteria for determining first-round and semifinal sites are: (1) availability of quality facilities, (2) consideration of financial success, (3) geographic location considering inclement weather, (4) seeding of teams, (5) competition from other

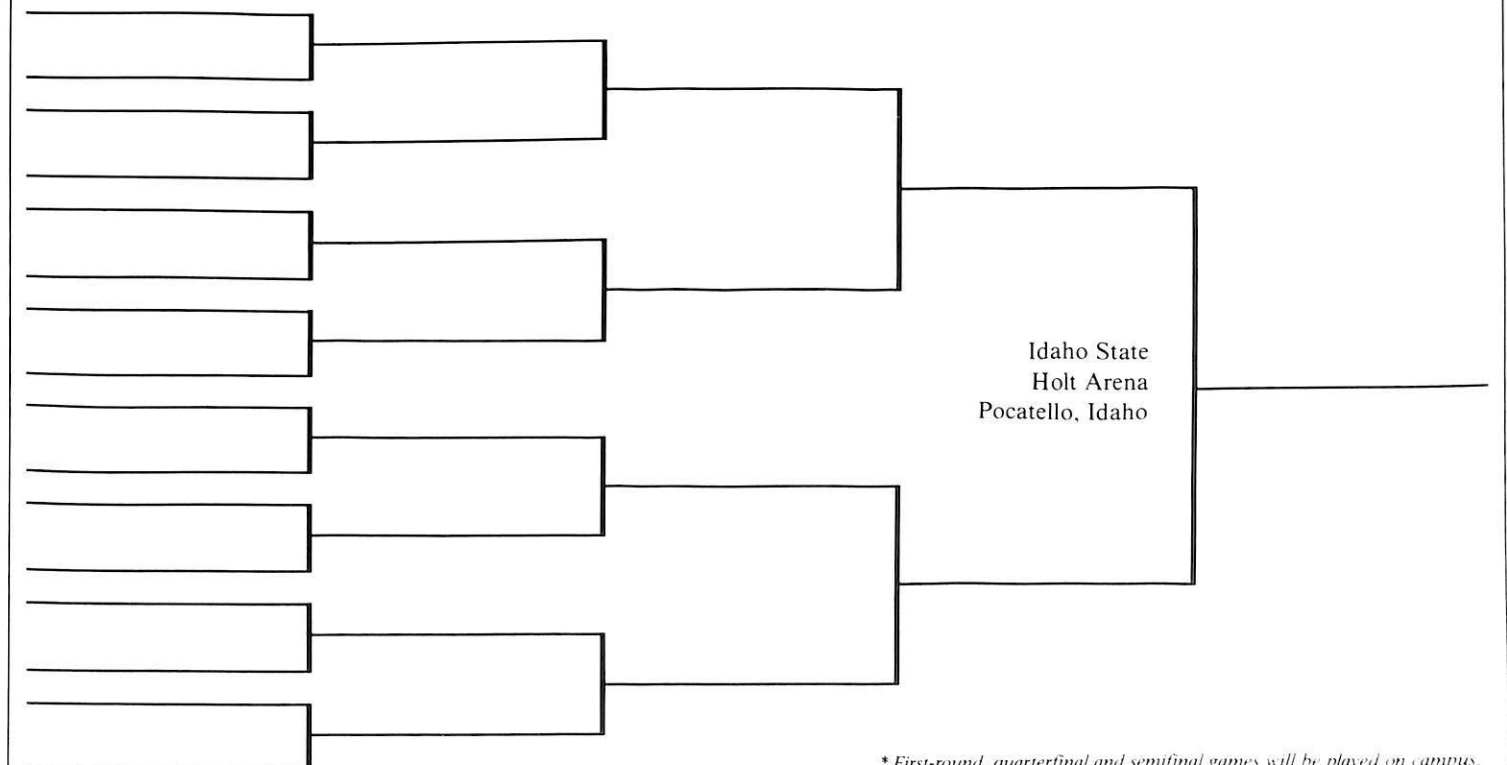

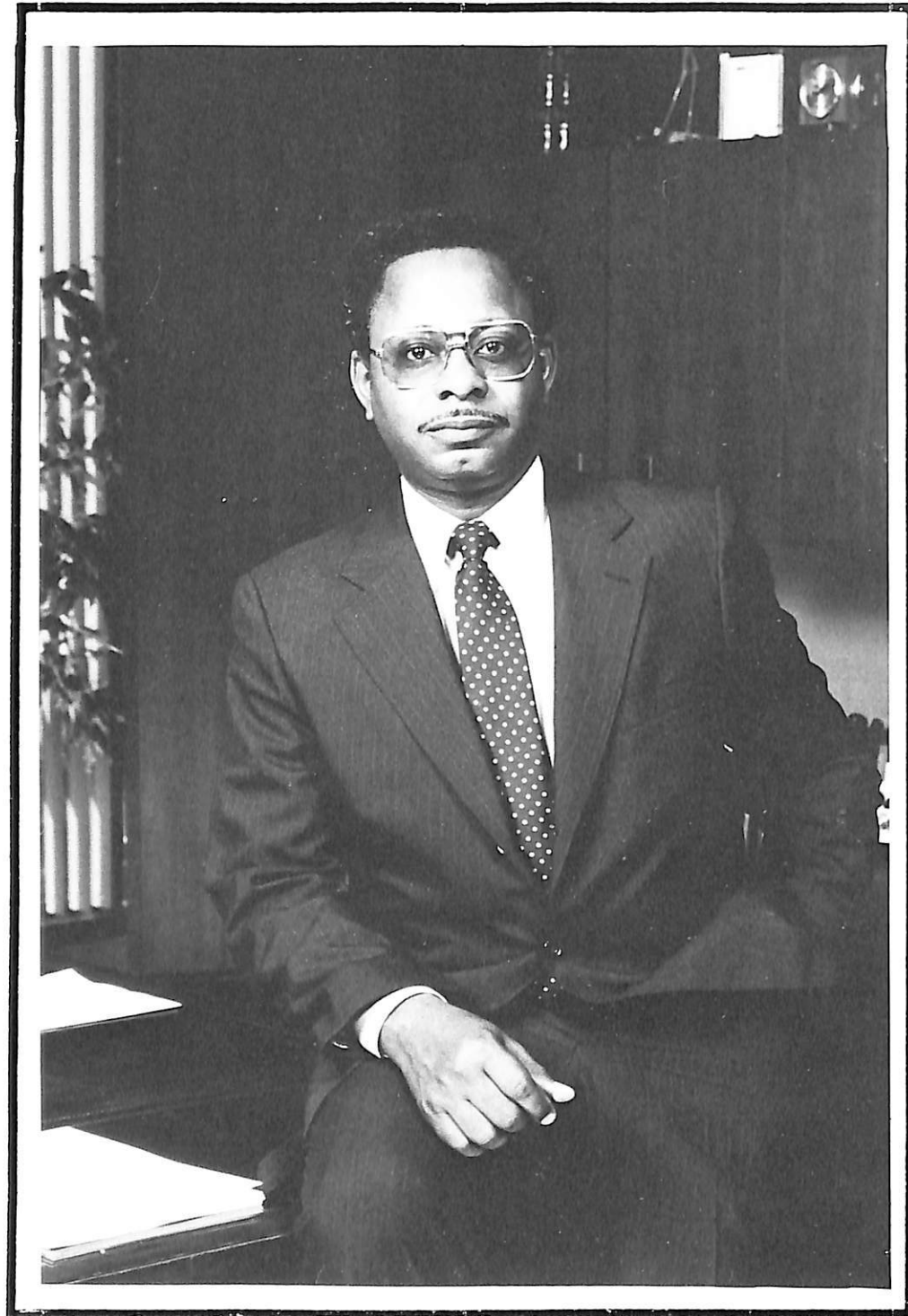
activities, (6) site of previous competition, (7) enthusiasm for hosting the championship and (8) experience in hosting championships.

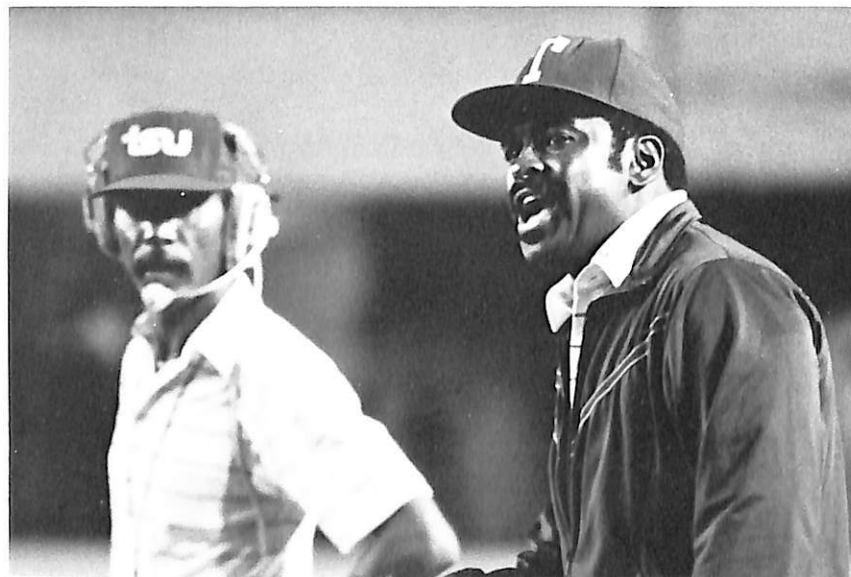

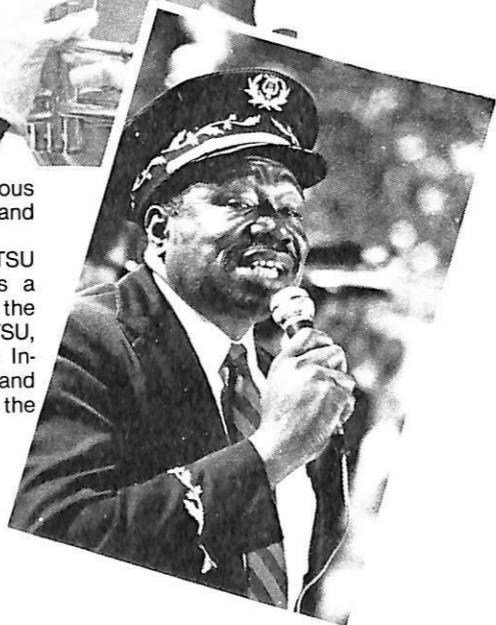


This year's band promises to be one of the largest, sharpest and most disciplined in the university's history. The band continues to march with its characteristic precision and
