SUMMARY OF PROCEDURE OF CANDIDATES FOR MASTER'S DEGREE

The steps involved in candidacy for the master's degree are outlined below in general order of sequence, but several steps may be taken at the same time:

1. Complete an approved program of studies totaling at least 45 quarter hours of credit, and consisting of a major of 45 hours, or a major of 27 hours and one minor of 18 hours or two minors of 9 hours each.
2. Have appointed a thesis committee composed of a major adviser representing the major field and two additional advisers representing fields appropriate to the student's major and minor.
3. Prepare a thesis under the supervision of the major adviser assisted by the other members of the committee.
4. File the completed thesis with signatures of all advisers in Office of Dean who will appoint an official reader to examine the thesis and report as to its acceptability.
5. Attend one or more seminars in preparation for final examination.
6. Stand a final oral examination before committee representing the college and the University of Tennessee. The examination will cover both the thesis and courses included in the student's program of studies.

WINTER QUARTER GRADES

The faculty of Tennessee State College gave for the Winter Quarter, 1945 a total of 5890 grades. Of this total 6.5% were A's, 25.0% were B's, 35.0% were C's, 12.0% were D's, 1.9% were I's, 6.7% were F's, and 8.0% were P's.
