FINANCIAL AWARDS...

RECEIVED BY THE UNIVERSITY RECENTLY HAVE COME FROM THE GENERAL MOTORS CORP., TO ASSIST COOP PROGRAMS IN ENGINEERING, SCIENCE, AND BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION; CHEVROLET DIVISION OF GM TO ASSIST HIGHER EDUCATION FOR NEEDY STUDENTS AND THE AMOCO FOUNDATION.

TENNESSEE TUITION GRANT PROGRAM...

MAY HAVE FUNDS AVAILABLE FOR WINTER AND SPRING AWARDS BECAUSE OF NO SHOWS, WITHDRAWALS, AND NORMAL ATTRITION, ACCORDING TO AN ANNOUNCEMENT FROM THE TENNESSEE STUDENT ASSISTANCE AGENCY. THE AGENCY ALSO REPORTS THAT 151 OF ITS FALL AWARDS WENT TO TENNESSEE STATE STUDENTS, AVERAGED AT \$343. TSAA GIVES PRIORITY TO STUDENTS WHOSE PARENTS OR LEGAL GUARDIANS HAVE AN AVERAGE INCOME OF LESS THAN \$5,000 A YEAR. STUDENTS WHO ARE TENNESSEE RESIDENTS ARE URGED TO APPLY FOR THE TENNESSEE TUITION GRANTS THROUGH THE STUDENT FINANCIAL AID OFFICE, 3RD FLOOR, A-BLDG.

NEW VETERANS LEGISLATION...

PASSED BY CONGRESS INCLUDES G. I. BILL AMENDMENTS (PUBLIC LAW 92-540), WHICH RAISES BENEFITS AND ESTABLISHES NEW V A STUDENT WORK-STUDY PROGRAM; CRANSTON VETERANS' COST OF INSTRUCTION AMENDMENT (PUBLIC LAW 92-318 TITLE X) WHICH AUTHORIZES \$300 PER STUDENT VETERAN PER YEAR AND \$450 PER DISADVANTAGED VETERAN TO BE PAID TO THE UNIVERSITY TO ESTABLISH OUTREACH, COUNSELING, AND OTHER VETERANS' SERVICES; VA HEALTH MANPOWER BILL (PUBLIC LAW 92-541), WHICH AUTHORIZES NEW PROGRAM OF GRANTS FOR HEALTH MANPOWER TRAINING PROGRAMS. FURTHER INFO WILL BE AVAILABLE LATER IN OFFICE OF VETERANS' AFFAIRS, WILLIAM BURKS, DIRECTOR, ROOM 205-EDUCATION BUILDING.
