SECRETARIES-MAKING-CONTRIBUTIONS...

TO THE TSU FOUNDATION RECENTLY, WERE THE TWO LADIES IN THE PRESIDENT'S OFFICE: MRS. THELMA CLANTON, WHO DONATED \$50 TO THE FUND AS UNRESTRICTED CONTRIBUTION, AND MRS. BERYL FARBES, WHO STIPULATED THAT HER \$35 GIFT SHOULD BE USED FOR THE TSU SECRETARIES' ASSOCIATION.

THE TSU-TVA JOINT PROJECT...

PRESENTLY BEING PREPARED FOR, IS CONCERNED WITH THE TRAINING OF RURAL DISADVANTAGED PERSONS IN HEAVY EQUIPMENT OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE, RECLAMATION OF PHOSPHATE STRIP MINE LAND, THE USE OF SUCH LAND FOR THE PRODUCTION OF HORTICULTURE CROPS, AND EFFECTIVE TECHNIQUES FOR MARKETING OF CROPS PRODUCED. THE TENNESSEE VALLEY AUTHORITY (TVA) IS PROVIDING THE FUNDS AND TECHNICAL ADVICE (UPON REQUEST). THE UNIVERSITY (TSU) IS PROVIDING THE LAND (APPROXIMATELY 40 ACRES), OVERALL ADMINISTRATION, COORDINATION, AND INSTRUCTION TO SELECTED GROUPS OF 20 DISADVANTAGED PERSONS EACH YEAR FOR THE NEXT FOUR YEARS IN 14-WEEK TRAINING COURSES.

FOUR \$500 SCHOLARSHIPS...

WILL BE PROVIDED 1973-74 SCHOOL YEAR GRADUATING SENIORS WHO ARE PREPARING FOR CAREERS IN ANIMAL SCIENCE, VETERINARY MEDICINE, OR AGRICULTURAL ESTATE, BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF UNITED FARM AGENCY, KANSAS CITY, MO. SELECTION OF RECIPIENTS IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE UNIVERSITY, ACCORDING TO CORPORATE INFORMATION SERVICES DIRECTOR, JACK R. WALN. HOMER WHEATON OF STUD. FINANCIAL AID HAS MORE INFORMATION.
