JASPER HALE, III, WHO IS A SENIOR AT HILO HIGH



A LETTER OF CONGRATULATIONS...

FROM PRES. A. P. TORRENCE, WENT TO BIOLOGICAL SCIENCES DEPARTMENT HEAD, DR. HENDERSON K. WOOD RECENTLY, CITING THE DEPARTMENT'S RECEIPT OF A \$210,806 GRANT AWARD FROM THE MINORITY SCHOOLS BIOMEDICAL SUPPORT PROGRAM OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH SERVICE, NATIONAL INSTITUTES OF HEALTH, U. S. DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, EDUCATION AND WELFARE. THE AWARD IS FOR A ONE-YEAR GRANT, BUT THE TOTAL PROJECT EXTENDS OVER A FIVE-YEAR PERIOD WITH ADDITIONAL GRANT AWARDS EACH YEAR FOR A TOTAL IN EXCESS OF ONE-HALF MILLION DOLLARS.

TO STRENGTHEN TSU FOUNDATION...

A TSU ALUMNUS, DR. LUTHER KINDALL, WAS ON CAMPUS LAST WEEK, AND PLEDGED \$600 TO THE TSU FOUNDATION. DR. KINDALL, A 1967 GRADUATE, WITH A MAJOR IN PSYCHOLOGY, IS NOW A MEMBER OF THE PSYCHOLOGY DEPARTMENT FACULTY AT THE UNI-VERSITY OF TENNESSEE IN KNOXVILLE. A NATIVE NASHVILLIAN, DR.
