Imbue with the spirit of wisdom those to whom in Thy name we entrust the authority of government, that there may be peace and justice at home; and that through obedience to Thy law we may show forth Thy praise among the nations of the earth. In the time of prosperity fill our hearts with thankfulness, and in the day of trouble, suffer not our trust in Thee to fail; all of which we ask through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen."

LIBRARY NOTES

Education, January, 1946

The current issue of Education magazine is an "inter-group education number". From the prefatory statement comes this description of its contents:

"There is a rough kind of system to the order in which the various contributions appear. First, an article on race since there are still too many who do not know that the biological facts of racial inheritance have nothing to do with a man's aptitude for successful participation in society. Second, an article which takes the point of view that it is not "in the stars but in ourselves" that we are prejudiced.

Next comes a group centering around the concept of culture The questionnaire which concludes this section provides readers with an opportunity to discover what their own education has done by way of equipping them for democratic living.

The fourth section on criticism shows how an examination of certain history textbooks makes the conclusion inevitable that we mis-educate from the beginning.

The fifth section contains discussions of the educational programs of some of the national organizations working partly or wholly in the field of inter-group relations. They should offer every professional educator both an inspiration and a challenge.

Sixth comes two "technique" articles, suggesting ways in which analysis of books and motion pictures can be made excellent educational devices for re-orientation along inter-group lines.

Seventh is another educational tool, a bibliography."

The issue contains such titles as "What every child and adult should know about "race", "A psychology of prejudice", "All blood is red", "A colored woman travels the United States". Time spent reading this magazine will prove quite profitable.
