

## ENERGY CONSERVATION MEASURES...

ARE BEING RECOMMENDED TO ALL MEMBERS OF THE UNIVERSITY COMMUNITY BY ACTING PRESIDENT, DR. CHARLES B. FANCHER. INCLUDED AMONG THE PRIORITY ITEMS ON THE LIST ARE ADMONITIONS TO REDUCE LIGHTING IN NON-ESSENTIAL OFFICE AREAS, HALLWAYS, RESTROOMS, AND LOBBIES AS WELL AS THE LIMITING OF USE OF ELECTRICAL OFFICE EQUIPMENT. SECRETARIES AND OTHER TY-PISTS ARE URGED TO MAKE CARBON COPIES IN-STEAD OF ELECTRONIC COPIES AS OFTEN AS POSSIBLE AND ALL ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT SHOULD BE KEPT TURNED OFF WHEN NOT IN USE.

FOR THE 1975 SPRING SEMESTER, "HAVE BEEN I SUED: BEFORE THE CHRISTMAS HOLIDAYS (PRIOR TO DECEMBER 4), STUDENTS RECEIVING FINANCIAL AID MUST REPORT TO FINANCIAL AID OFFICE, 3RD FL A-BLDG. TO FILL IN THE FORM TO REQUEST ADVANCED PAYMENT FOR SPRING SEMESTER. (BETWEEN DEC. 6-& 117, ALL STUDENTS REPORT TO FACULTY ADVISER TO OBTAIN REGISTRATION FORMS AND SELECT COUURSES FOR SPRING SEMESTER: (SCHEDULE WILL BE AVAIL-ABLE IN ADVISER'S OFFICE). ADVISERS FOR EVEN-ING GRAD. STUDENTS WILL BE IN ROOM 102, GRAD BLDG. EACH DAY FROM 5 TO 7 P. M. ALL STUDENTS, EXCEPT EVENING GRAD STUDENTS REPORT TO THE WOMEN'S BL AUD. TO RECEIVE OFFICIAL INDIVIDUAL PROGRAM OF CLASSES FOR WHICH SPRING SEMESTER ENROLLMENT HAS BEEN COMPLETED EXCEPT PAYMENT OF FEES. DIVIDUAL PROGRAM FOR EVENING GRAD. STUDENTS WILL BE AVAILABLE IN ROOM 107, GRAD BLDG. (DEC. 17-20). BETWEEN DECEMBER 6-20, ALL STUDENTS EXCEPT EVENING GRAD STUDENTS TAKE REGISTRATION MATERIALS TO APPROPRIATE PERSONNEL DEAN'S OFC.
