#### POSTDOCTORAL FELLOWSHIPS...

ARE AVAILABLE FOR THE 1976-77 ACADEMIC YEAR THROUGH THE INDO-U.S. SUBCOMMISSION ON EDUCATION AND CULTURE. CALLED THE IND-AMERICAN FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM, THE TEN MONTHS FELLOWSHIPS ALLOW EACH A BASIC GRANT OF FROM \$12,000 TO \$15,000 DEPENDING ON ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT AND SENIORITY, \$5,000 PAYABLE IN DOLLARS, THE BALANCE IN RUPEES, ETC. APPLICATIONS SHOULD BE SENT TO THE COUNCIL FOR INTERNATIONAL EXCHANGE OF SCHOLARS, ELEVEN DUPONT CIRCLE, WASHINGTON, D. C. 20036 BY FEBRUARY 2. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION MAY BE ACQUIRED FROM THE SAME ADDRESS.
