SOME OF THE MONETARY GIFTS PRESENTED THROUGH THE FOUNDATION AND DIRECTLY TO THE UNIVERSITY WITHIN THE PAST TWO MONTHS INCLUDE A \$10,000 TSU GIFT THROUGH THE FOUNDATION FOR USE IN DEVELOPMENT OFFICE PROGRAMS; \$10,000 FROM THE ALCOA FOUNDATION OF PITTSBURGH, PA. FOR SCHOOL OF ENGINEERING SCHOLARSHIPS; \$5,000 FROM CHATTANOOGA'S PROVIDENT LIFE & ACCIDENT INSURANCE CO. FOR FIVE \$1,000 SCHOLARSHIPS TO BE AWARDED TO 1976-77 MATHE-MATICS MAJORS; A \$4,328 GRANT FROM GULF OIL FOUNDATION, PITTSBURGH, PA., FOR MECHANICAL EN-GINEERING AND HONORS PROGRAM AND INCLUDED IN THE SUM IS A \$400 UNRESTRICTED GRANT; \$3,000 FROM WILMINGTON, DEL.'S HERCULES, INC.
