KOFI OPOKA OF THE UNIVERSITY OF GHANA SPEAKING ON "THE INSTITUTIONAL CHURCH;" AT FISK UNIVERSITY; A 10 A.M. WORSHIP SERVICE AT SCARRITT COLLEGE AND ONE AT VANDERBILT DIVINITY SCHOOL; A 11 A. M. WORSHIP SERVICE AT FISK UNIVERSITY WITH PREACHING BY THE RT REV. JOHN HURST ADAMS, BISHOP, THE TENTH EPISCOPAL DISTRICT OF THE A.M.E. CHURCH, WACO, TX; 1 TO 5 P. M.
