DR. BAQAR HUSSAINI ...

OF THE SOCIOLOGY DEPARTMENT, GAVE A RESEARCH PAPER AT THE SOUTHERN SOCIOLOGICAL CONFERENCE AT MIAMI BEACH, FLA., LAST WEEK ON ACHIEVEMENT MOTIVATION, SELF-ESTEEM, AND WORK ORIENTATION AMONG BLACK AND WHITE COLEGE MALES. DR. HUSSAINI FOUND THAT THERE ARE NO SIGNIFICANT DIFFERENCES BETWEEN BLACKS AND WHITES RELATIVE TO SELF-ESTEEM AND COMPETITIVE WORK ORIENTATION. HOWEVER, BLACKS ARE HIGHER ON SECURITY WORK ORIENTATION PROBABLY BECAUSE OF THEIR CONCERN ABOUT DISCRIMINATORY EMPLOYMENT PRACTICES AND A RELATIVELY HIGH UNEMPLOYMENT RATE AMONG BLACKS.
