WAS PRESENTED TO DR. FREDERICK S. HUMPHRIES, UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT BY U. S. REPRESENTATIVE CLIFFORD ALLEN AS PART OF FOUNDERS DAY CONVOCATION ACTIVITIES APRIL 19 IN RECOGNITION OF THE UNIVERSITY'S PARTICIPATION IN THE NATIONALLY-HONORED TENNESSEE STATEWIDE CONSUMER EDUCATION PROGRAM. JAMES LEMONS, ALSO ON HAND FOR THE PRESENTATION HEADS TSU'S PORTION OF THE STATEWISE PROJECT. THE FLAG WAS RAISED AFTER THE CEREMONY BY A CONTINGENT OF AFROTC DETACHMENT 790 CADETS.

A RECENT ANNOUNCEMENT ...

FROM THE UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT, DR. FRED-ERICK S. HUMPHRIES REVEALS THAT STATE APPRO-PRIATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE FOR THE CONSTRUC-TION OF SEVERAL BUILDINGS ON THE CAMPUS. THESE INCLUDE THE NEW LIBRARY , APPROXIMATE COST OF WHICH IS \$2,350,164; THE BUILDING TO BE USED FOR RESEARCH AND INSTRUCTION BY THE SCHOOL OF BUSINESS, \$1,678,810. THESE BUILDINGS ARE ON SOUTH CAMPUS. NORTH CAMPUS , ADDITIONS ARE BEING MADE TO THE HEATING PLANT FOR CENTRAL HEATING AND CHILLING. APPROXIMATE COST FOR THIS FACILITY IS \$1,024,119. APPROXIMATE COST OF THE GRAD-UATE SCHOOL WHICH WAS CONSTRUCTED IN 1967 WAS ALSO INDICATED IN THE ANNOUNCEMENT, \$795,000, ALONG WITH INFORMATION THAT SUGGES-TIONS FOR NAMES FOR THESE BUILDINGS MAY BE MADE TO THE MERITORIOUS AWARDS COMMITTEE, MRS. MIRIAM G. TOWNS, CHAIRMAN, BOX 523, CAMPUS P. O. APPROPRIATE FORMS FOR THE SUBMISSION OF NAMES MAY BE OBTAINED FROM MRS. TOWNS ON RE-QUEST.

AT THE FOURTH ANNUAL XAVIER-MBS BIOMEDI-CAL SYMPOSIUM IN NEW ORLEANS, LA. FARLIER THIS MONTH, BY 10 STUDENTS AND TWO SORS FROM THE UNIVERSITY'S BIOLOGY DEPARTMENT. THE PAPERS WERE PRESENTED IN THE AREAS OF PROTOZOOLOGY, ENVIRONMENTAL CHEMISTRY, ENVIRON-MENTAL BIOLOGY, ANTI-MICROBIAL BIOLOGY, BOTANY, AND MICROBIOLOGY.
